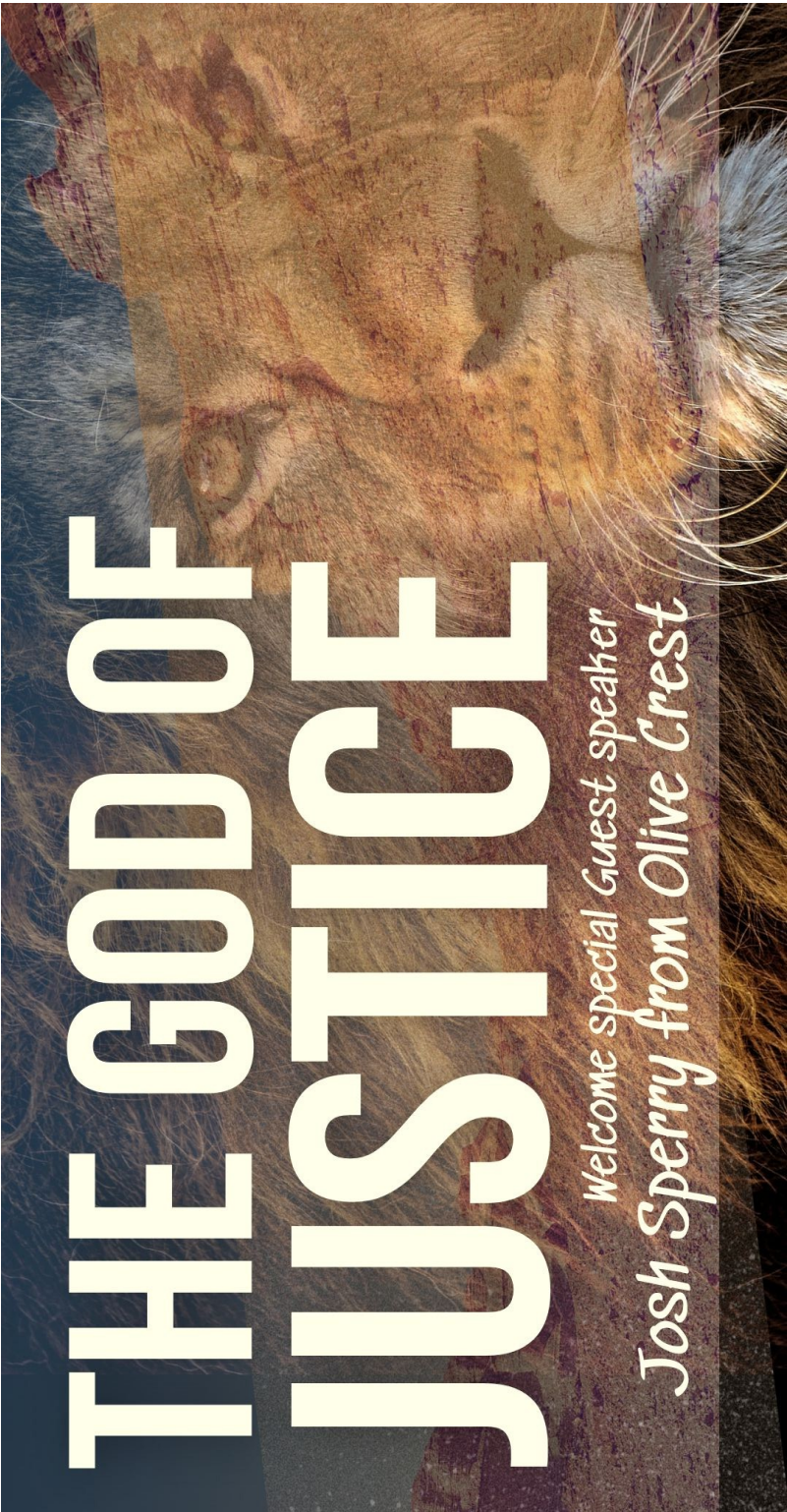




ANNOUNCEMENTS:

A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

In Churches of Christ, we like to think of ourselves as New Testament congregations. We look heavily to the Bible trying to imitate the teachings and practices of the church that we read about in the New Testament, adapted to our own time and place. A key characteristic of that New Testament church was the commonality the believers in Christ shared together. They met together, ate together, and shared their possessions with one another. We are told that they "had everything in common" (Acts 2:44), that "they were one in heart and mind", and that "No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had." (Acts 4:32).

Today, some of our families are experiencing a temporary loss of income due to the government shutdown. **We'd like to help.** One of our Life Groups is collecting food and making it available to anyone who has need. If you can use any of the items, please let us help. We consider it a blessing to be able to share. Beyond that, many of us are not experiencing any loss of income and we can help with additional financial needs. All you have to do is to let one of the elders (Lane, David, or Mike) know. You are not alone. You are part of a congregation – a family if you will – of believers with a rich heritage of helping one another.

How to Help:

Over the next few weeks, or until this shutdown is resolved, consider purchasing extra grocery items when you do your grocery shopping.

Each Sunday, nonperishable food items can be dropped off in the **new cement planter boxes in front of the church building** and anyone that could use them can grab what they need on their way out. *Any items left at the end of the day will be donated to the food bank.*

If you would like to make a monetary donation, or could benefit from financial assistance, please speak with any of our elders directly.

Most importantly, **Pray.** Pray for those in our community who continue to work without pay and for those in our government who are tasked with making these decisions that are affecting so many.

Walking Together – Transforming Lives – Passing It On

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

For many years, God has given us the privilege of serving Him among university students in Hanoi. Many have heard the Gospel, and many hearts have been touched and transformed.

Yet, there are still hundreds of thousands of students who have never once heard about the saving love of Jesus Christ. This is what has moved us to begin the Fly High Scholarship Project - a doorway for students not only to receive support in their studies but also to encounter the Gospel and be transformed by faith. We aim to reach 200 first-year students this school year through The Road to Success media platform and personal invitations from Christian friends. □ 160 USD / 1 student / 2 semesters

What is the Fly High Scholarship? Supporting disadvantaged students to continue their Studies. Opportunities to join skill-building, language, and counseling classes. Ongoing care and discipleship in faith. Most importantly: Hearing the Gospel and having the chance to share it with friends. Goals for the 2025–2026 school year: 200 students will be reached and hear the Gospel/50 students will come to Christ/20 students will be disciplined and nurtured in faith/30 scholarships will be awarded

How the Project Will Be Carried Out? Interviews and Selection. All 200 students will take part in an interview process. Among them, the 30 most promising students will receive a 160 USD cash scholarship (covering 2 semesters).

Lasting Impact In the future, as scholarship recipients are transformed by God, they will in turn support and nurture the next generations of students. What they receive today will become a blessing and encouragement for many generations to come.
