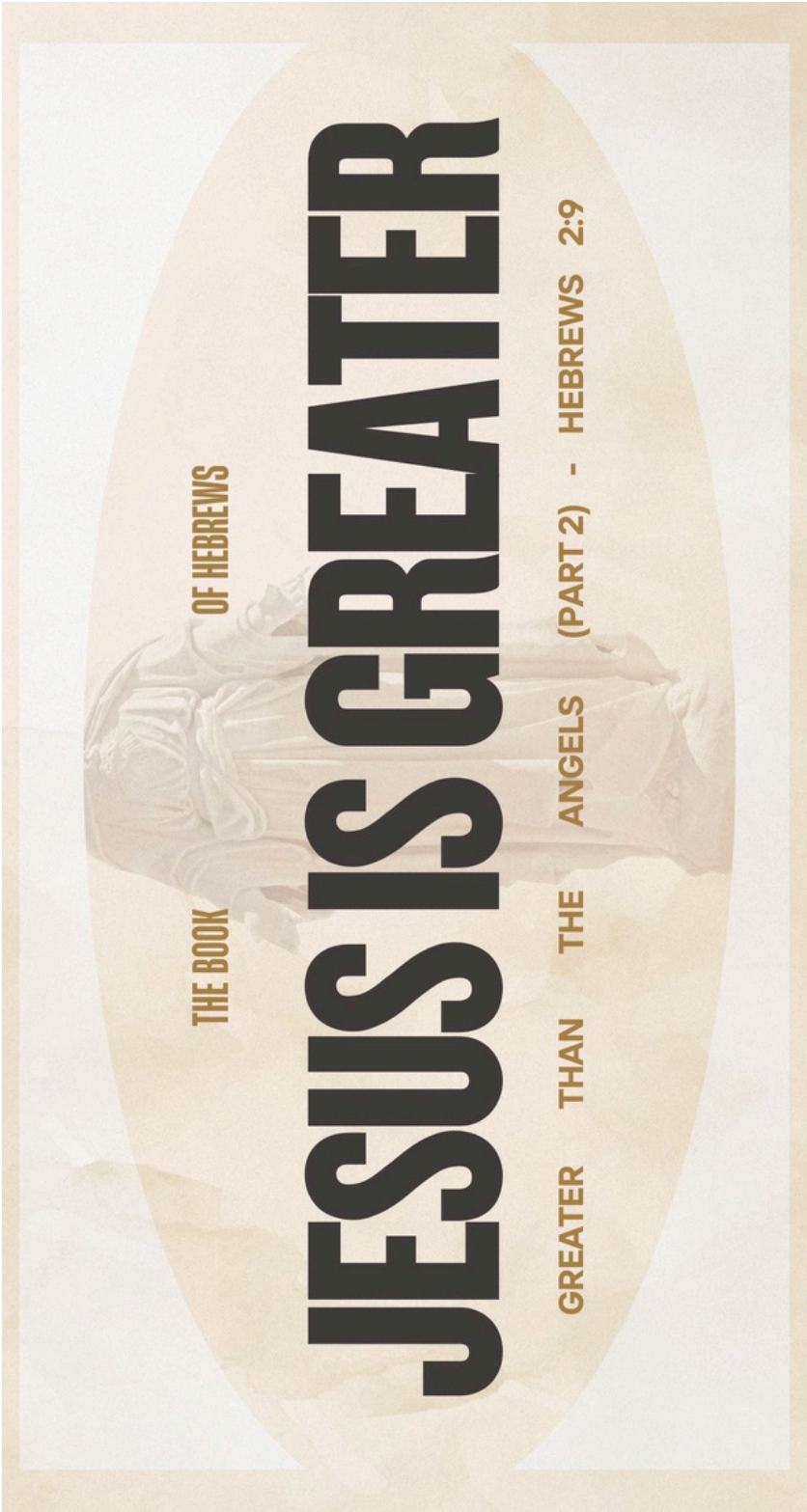

# Message from the Elders:

**I hear Dad calling!**  
The following is not intended to detract from the importance or significance of one’s mother. That stated...  
Growing up I recall certain rituals that were repeated on a nightly basis. Mom would be in the kitchen cooking the family meal, children would be playing with neighbors, doing chores, or finishing up homework. All the while, we eagerly awaited the time when our father would return home from work. With almost clock-like precision, he would pull into the driveway about 5:30 PM each evening. He would greet whoever was home at the time with a hug and a kiss on the forehead. Then, turning toward the neighborhood, while standing on the porch, he would let out a long loud whistle. You know, like the one’s often heard at sporting events. It was loud, definitive, and unmistakable. It cut through the air like a hot bullet through warm butter. The shrill was similar to the sound of a “Piccolo-Pete” often heard on the fourth of July and could be heard from three blocks away! It meant one thing: Dad’s home and that means it’s time for you to come home too.  
As children, we knew the sound of our father’s call. We also knew what it promised –a waiting hug, a toss of the football or possibly a game of “catch”. Also waiting was our place at the table and a nourishing meal, and if one is honest, there was also discipline when circumstances warranted. But no matter what, there was always a father who loved us. It was the best of times.  
Oddly enough, the feeling is very similar to the times we assemble as a congregation. When we gather, we have the opportunity to fellowship with other believers. It’s a place of love. It’s a time to share godly love as we edify and encourage each other. Our assemblies are also a place to feast on God’s word, whether in a class or during one of the fine sermons we are blessed with each week.  
23 *Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.* 24 *And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds,* 25 *not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.* Hebrews 10:23-25  
Make it your goal to attend our weekly gatherings. They are an excellent opportunity to be encouraged, and to be an encouragement to your brothers and sisters in Christ our Lord. Also, consider inviting a guest just like you used to do as a child to your own family dinners. It’s an excellent way to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.
