

Message from the Elders:

Seek Peace

In recent days, activists have made national news by disrupting a group of Christians who had gathered at their local meeting place for a time of worship and praise. Standing in the aisles, activists with raised hands shouted and ranted just inches from those who had gathered for a time of peaceful contemplation, forcing the service to end prematurely. It was no doubt a time of confusion, frustration, anger, and fear. Intimidation and provocation were their objective. To their credit, the congregation did not respond in kind. Rather, pastoral staff made every effort to calm the congregants. Many could be seen on their knees praying while activists shouted in their faces. Help was summoned and local authorities responded. Order was eventually restored.

Praise the Lord, nothing like that has occurred within our doors, but that is not to say it couldn't. Individuals, activists, and special interest groups are seeking out increasingly bold ways to draw national attention to themselves which now includes disrupting places of worship. While the probability of it happening here remains low, should a similar incident occur, we ask you to respond in a manner befitting one's faith.

- Remain Calm.
- Do not confront.
- Do all you can to avoid a heated exchange or physical response.
- If you are able, offer help to others who are in need.
- Listen to directions from our Pastoral Staff or Incident Management Team.
- If necessary, the Incident Management Team will make themselves known.

Follow their directions to help ensure everyone's safety. Remember, in the best of times and in the worst of times, Christians seek to exemplify all that is good: peace, love, patience, humility, kindness, gentleness, and self-control. May the Lord our God bless those gathered in His name with peace and tranquility as we seek to worship the Lord, our Savior.
