From the Pastor...



Halloween is a contracted word for All Hallows' Eve. Hallows is an old English word for holy ones, or saints. As it is popularly celebrated in our culture, it seems to be mere revelry in all things spooky, fearful, and evil. While Christians should not rejoice in evil and merely revel in fear, the scary side of Halloween does have a proper place.

Halloween and All Saints in the church calendar is a memorial celebration of departed believers, who have died. The roots of the celebration were initially a memorial celebration for Christian martyrs. These are believers, like Saint Antipas of Pergamum, who is mentioned in Revelation 2:12-17. Jesus himself encourages the believers in Pergamum in this way: "I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is. Yet you hold fast my name, and you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you where Satan dwells."

Halloween is a reminder that we live in a scary world, where evil wields the threat of death like a weapon to make people afraid to bear faithful witness to the Truth as Antipas did. The All Saints' celebration is the Church's Memorial Day. We are especially to remember those who came face to face with evil but did not allow fear of death deter them from their faith in the One who through death, defeated the devil who uses the fear of death to keep people enslaved (Heb 2:14-15). That is something worth celebrating!






