From the Pastor...

Sometimes skeptics claim that beliefs about the resurrection and Lordship of Jesus were legends that developed over a long period of time. The reality is that belief in the resurrection of Jesus was proclaimed early, very early, and often.

Dr. Gary Habermas, an expert on the facts and arguments regarding the resurrection of Jesus, says the written evidence is incredibly early compared to written sources about other ancient historical figures. Written sources about the life of Alexander the Great, for example, date to almost



300 years after he died. The sources for the life of Siddhartha Gautama, the Buddha, are over 600 years later. In contrast, written testimony about Jesus appeared within twenty-five years, and included belief in the bodily resurrection.

Saint Paul, who became a follower of Jesus just a few years after Jesus' death and resurrection, for instance, wrote 1 Corinthians between 53-55 A.D. In it he declares the earliest professions of faith of Jesus' first disciples.

"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures," (1 Cor 15:3-4).

Paul goes on there to write that Jesus also appeared to hundreds of people in his resurrected body. This is the witness of the earliest sources, which by any standard of the study of ancient history are unprecedented in how early they appear. Moreover, the testimony shared by Paul is in harmony with the witness of the rest of the New Testament documents, all of which were written within 70 years of the events.

Our faith is firmly rooted and grounded in history and very early written evidence! We have good reason for the hope God has given us in Christ Jesus, His Son!
