

From the Pastor...

Some of you may have grown up with the tradition of getting new clothes to wear on Easter. This tradition echoes an all-important lesson for Christian discipleship. Through faith in Jesus and his atoning, sacrificial death on the cross and his resurrection, we receive forgiveness of sins and a new birth. In the Bible, sometimes forgiveness and salvation are likened to receiving new clothes.



"And the angel said to those who were standing before him, 'Remove the filthy garments from him.' And to him he said, 'Behold, I have taken your iniquity away from you, and I will clothe you with pure vestments." Zech 3:4 ESV

Galatians 3:27 says, "And all who have been united with Christ in baptism have put on Christ, like putting on new clothes" (NLT). Elsewhere, however, the Bible makes it clear that putting on the righteousness and holiness of Christ is not just a one-time event in the life of a believer. It must be a continuous process even after initial salvation. We must keep putting on more and more of 'the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness" (Eph 4:24 ESV; see also Rom 13:14). Just as importantly, the process also involves continually putting off the filthy garments of our old sinful nature (see Eph 4:22ff; Rom 13:12-14).

As we enter this season of Lent, let this process of ridding ourselves of the filthy garments of sin and dressing ourselves more and more in the gift of righteousness in Jesus Christ guide us into a glorious celebration of the newness of life we have been given in Christ on Easter!






~Community Breakfast~




