^{1 Corinthians 10:6} These things took place as examples for us, so that we will not desire evil things as they did.




^{24:1-2a} Joshua assembled all the tribes of Israel at Shechem and summoned Israel's elders, leaders, judges, and officers, and they presented themselves before God. ² Joshua said to all the people, "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says...



^{24:2-4} "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'Long ago your ancestors, including Terah, the father of Abraham and Nahor, lived beyond the Euphrates River and worshiped other gods. 3 But I took your father Abraham from the region beyond the Euphrates River, led him throughout the land of Canaan, and multiplied his descendants. I gave him Isaac, 4 and to Isaac I gave Jacob and Esau. I gave the hill country of Seir to Esau as a possession. Jacob and his sons, however, went down to Egypt.

Genesis 4:4 Eve also gave birth to his brother Abel. Now Abel became a shepherd of flocks, but Cain worked the ground.





^{24:22-24} Joshua then told the people, "You are witnesses against yourselves that you yourselves have chosen to worship the LORD." "We are witnesses," they said.

^{1 Corinthians 10:11-12} These things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our instruction, on whom the ends of the ages, have come. ¹² So, whoever thinks he stands must be careful not to fall.

Israel has been able to serve such gods. She could build images for them, dress them, perfume them, build a house for them, bring sacrifices to feed them, carry them in processions, even bury them in appropriate moments... For the common worshipers, it was certainly within their possibilities to serve the gods they knew, indeed, to serve several of them simultaneously. Joshua has detected this in the response of the people. They see God as the one who is bound to protect them along their way, so they can protect him by serving him.
