2. 3. Are there ways in which things like discontentment or fear tend to diminish your faithfulness to the Lord?
4. Is there a lesson you might apply from looking at Caleb's example of long-term faithfulness?
5. Identify a New Testament statement that describes a way in which God has supplied sufficient resources for you to obey Him (Ex. 2 Peter 1:3-8). What has God supplied and what are you being called to do with His supply?
