



Prayer is simply talking with God.


Prayer is not only something that we should feel like we have to do, but it should be something that we want to do. The more we learn about prayer, the more natural it becomes. It's like talking with your best friend all the time. Prayer and talking with Jesus should be the best and most fun part of our day!

Prayer should be part of our everyday life. You can pray:

- Before the start of the day
- Before you head to school
- Before you hang out with your friends
- Before practice
- Before you compete in a big game
- Before you go to bed
- When something bad happens
- When something good happens

In every situation, we should PRAY FIRST!







WHAT IS FASTING?

Fasting is choosing not to eat food, or certain foods, in order to depend on God.

Fasting is one of the oldest and most frequent spiritual practices in the Bible. Great leaders in the Bible fasted routinely, including Moses, David, Jeremiah, Isaiah, John the Baptist, Jesus and the disciples. Jesus expects that we will fast regularly (Matthew 6:16).

The goal of fasting...

- is to draw nearer to God.
- allows us to create space in our minds and hearts for more of God's presence.
- helps us focus on God instead of our comforts and conveniences.
- reminds us that God provides every good and perfect gift.
- helps us open our heart to hear from God, no matter our age.

For kids, fasting looks a little different than it does for adults, but the purpose is still the same! It could look like choosing not to eat sweets or a favorite food. It's also okay if you are not ready to fast and you can still grow in connecting with God.



DAY 1:

SEEK GOD'S KINGDOM FIRST

Devotional:

Life with Jesus is such an amazing adventure. The Bible tells us in Matthew 6:33 to seek FIRST God's kingdom and all these things will be added. Imagine a treasure hunt where the prize is more valuable than anything you can imagine! God's kingdom is that treasure, full of love, joy, and everything you need. God's kingdom is the best prize and God promises that we will find Him if we look for Him with all our heart. We can experience God's kingdom here on earth in our everyday lives. We simply need to choose to seek God's kingdom first before anything else. All day long, look for God and his kingdom in the big and small things. God will guide you to more of His kingdom and more of His treasure here on earth.


DIVE DEEPER:

Devotional:

As you think about your actions and ways, allow God to speak and move in them. Create an opportunity to allow God to change your ways so that we can align with Him. As a family, you can shift your mindset to thankfulness and gratitude, and there is where God will meet you in all you do.

I WANT TO THINK LIKE JESUS

Devotional:

Today, let's discover the power of transforming our minds. God wants us to think about things that are good, true, and full of joy. When we choose to see things the way that God sees them, we are choosing to transform or "change" our minds. How we think impacts how we speak and act. If we think like Jesus, it becomes more natural for us to speak and act like Jesus with our family, with our friends, and even to ourselves. You're probably wondering how you can change your mind. Well, you can meditate on what God says about you and read His word. God's word is filled with His truth about you. Pick a scripture and write it down. As you do, practice repeating it out loud over yourself. Let your mind be renewed as you meditate on God's word. Renewing happens when we let what the Bible says change the way that we think and act.

Jesus, help me to change the way I think to look more like you. Renew my mind as I let your word sink into my heart. Amen.

Devotional:

Just like the trees you see around you, we all get the opportunity to grow. Whether you are 5 years old or 55 years old, the opportunity for growth is everywhere! We see growth in the creation that God made, in the people around us, and even in our minds, bodies, and hearts. Growth is not a one-time thing, but a lifelong process. Growth happens when you go to school when you play with your friends, and when you spend time as a family. You can find growth in all that you do. Also, we all get the opportunity to grow our relationship with God. When we choose to put God first in our lives and spend time with Him, we will see growth. In Psalm I, it talks about trees being planted by the stream. When the trees are planted by the stream we see that there is fruit in every season. In these verses think of us as the tree and the stream as God. When we plant ourselves close to God and spend time with Him, we will continue to grow and produce fruit. This allows us to grow in our faith, love, joy and so many other gifts that the Lord wants to give us. 

Habakkuk 2:2-3, Proverbs 29:18, Proverbs 3:5-6, John 16:13


TALK IT OUT:

Devotional:

- He grows character (fruit) in our lives (Gal 5)
- He gives us gifts of faith, mercy, wisdom, and more (1 Cor 12-14)

Devotional:

Devotional:

Devotional:

He shows us that the Bible is the playbook of how to love. Picture it this way: love is our tool for strong relationships. So, let's choose to love one another every day. It's not all about big gestures, just little acts of kindness. Love is one of the main ways that we can look like Jesus to the outside world and inside God's church. There are 59 different ways in the New Testament that we are told to love one another by praying, serving, being humble, encouraging, and forgiving.

PEACE IN ALL THINGS

Devotional:

Peace is such an incredible gift from God. When we give our lives to God, we can receive many gifts, one of them being peace. That way when we walk through anything in life we can have the peace of God in everything we do. Whether you are having a great day or a hard day, peace is your portion. 2 Thessalonians 3:16 says "Now may the Lord of peace himself give you his peace at all times and in every situation. Matthew 5:9, John 16:33, 2 Thessalonians 3:16, Isaiah 26:3, John 14:27




MAKE IT STICK:

Devotional:



GROW IN WISDOM

Devotional:

Wisdom is an important part of our walk with God. Throughout God's Word, we see many references to the importance of wisdom in our everyday life. Proverbs is one of the many books that talk about the importance of wisdom. Proverbs 2:6–7 says "For the Lord grants wisdom! From his mouth comes knowledge and understanding. He grants a treasure of common sense to the honest. He is a shield to those who walk with integrity." These verses show us that wisdom is important, but it is also something that God will give to us over and over. We can walk and learn in wisdom as we continue to walk with God in all we do. As a family, wisdom can help you grow together and allow you to learn that no matter what you may be walking through, the Lord has wisdom that He wants to give you and your family.

PRAY IT OUT:

Devotional:

SPIRITUAL DISCERNMENT

Devotional:

That's where spiritual discernment comes in—a bit like being detectives of the heart! Hebrews 5:IH, says we can grow in discernment, kind of like superheroes leveling up. Spiritual discernment helps us recognize what's good and true in the big adventure of life. When you face choices, ask God for discernment. It's not about being perfect but learning to listen to that little nudge inside your heart, helping you make the best decisions. Let's grow together in spiritual discernment. As we learn to listen to God's whispers, your family becomes a team of wise investigators, navigating life's mysteries with courage and love.

PRAY ALWAYS

Devotional:
