We must remember that Jesus was not talking about Peter or the disciples. Jesus was pointing to what Peter said. Peter said that Jesus was "the Messiah, the son of the Living God." It was on that truth about Jesus that he was actually going to build on. That truth is not meant to harm or confuse people. That truth is to give people new life and set them free.

In our April message series "Living Church" we are going to look at how we can live in the truth of Jesus and be the kind of church he wanted to build. We will look through the Book of Acts at the original gathering of people we today call the church.
