Yet that’s exactly what makes Coach **Igor Torres** so awesome, he’s the guy who knows how to coach a killer lay-up and explain how your hamstrings actually work. I recently sat down with Coach Torres to hear how he juggles his dual roles as a basketball coach and science teacher, and what drives him to keep giving his all.

The Biggest Challenge

Coach Torres says the hardest part of balancing teaching and coaching is during the basketball season. During this time he has trips with the team but also needs to give tests and assignments to his students. He explained how that is, and said. “It’s definitely difficult, and it doesn’t get easier every year.”

He feels like he’s working all the time and sometimes gets burnt out. But he tries to make the most of the rest he gets and learns to say no to things when he needs to take care of himself.

How He Measures Success

When I asked him how he measures success, he said, “On the court, there is the usual way of looking at success, how many wins you get, but I think that’s very superficial. I feel like success comes with the growth that I can bring.” For him, success is about the growth he sees in his players, especially on the junior varsity team. He wants to help them get ready for the varsity or national team. Seeing players improve and become ready is what makes him feel successful.

He also looks for growth in the classroom, not just through grades, but through how students change as people.

“Sometimes you don’t have much data because it’s not just about grades, but noticing little changes and growth during the year.”

Advice for Those Who Want to Follow His Path

When asked what advice he’d give to someone wanting to be both a coach and a teacher, he said, “Don’t, Nah I’m playing”. He emphasized doing your best because you are a role model. He also stressed how important it is to find time for yourself, manage your time well, and know when to be productive and when to rest. “Maybe the moments when you’re not being productive are the moments you should be resting.”

Fun Question

“If you could coach or teach anyone in the world, who would it be and why?”

“Not Gabe Solarski. (basketball player) No, I’m playing...” He said it’s a really hard question and that he’d actually rather be coached or taught by someone. When asked if he would think about teaching someone like Steph Curry.

He said, “I don’t know if I have anything to teach Steph Curry. I could be taught by him. I could have Steph Curry as my coach for a little bit, see if I can learn something.”

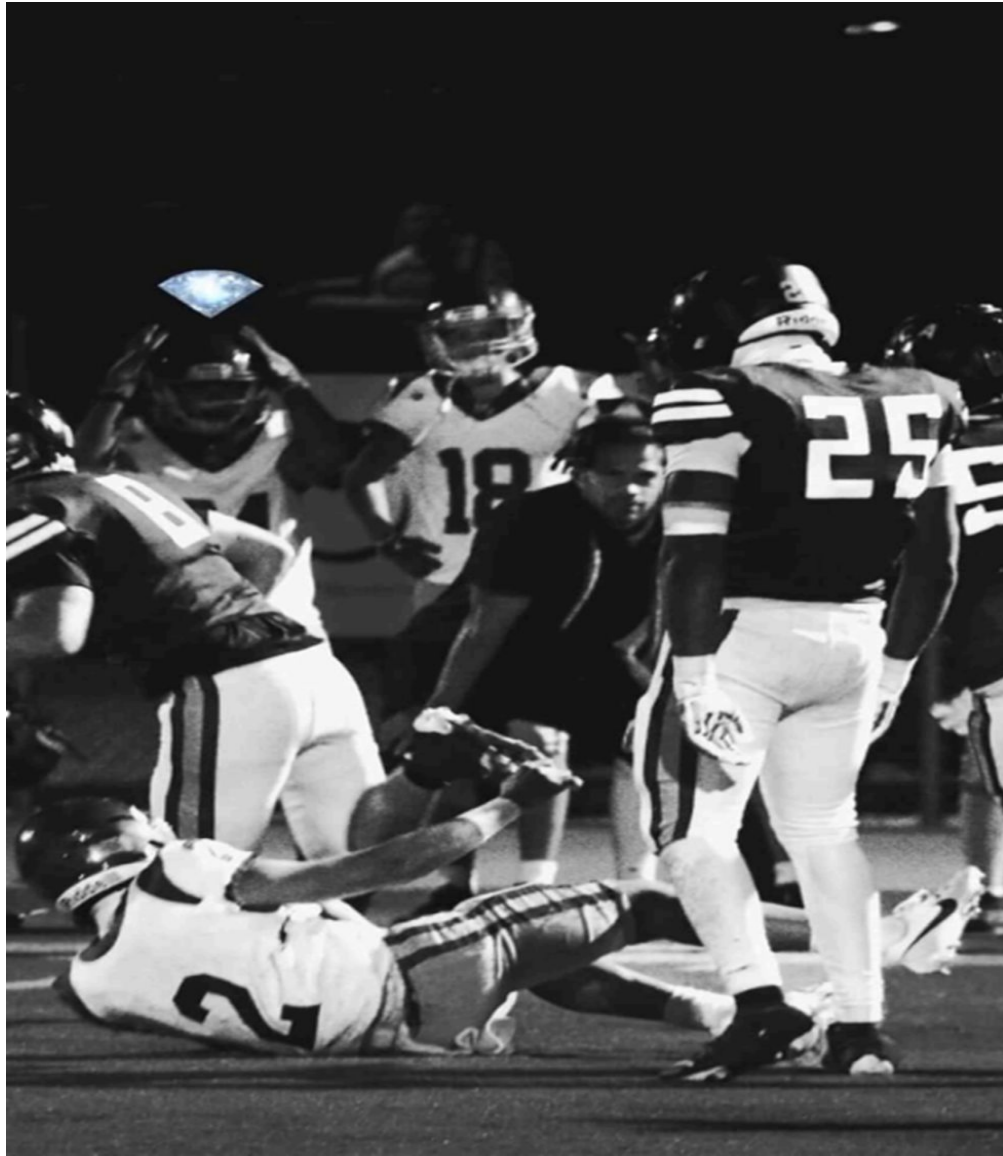
Closing

Barack Muhindo Led the Way to a Win

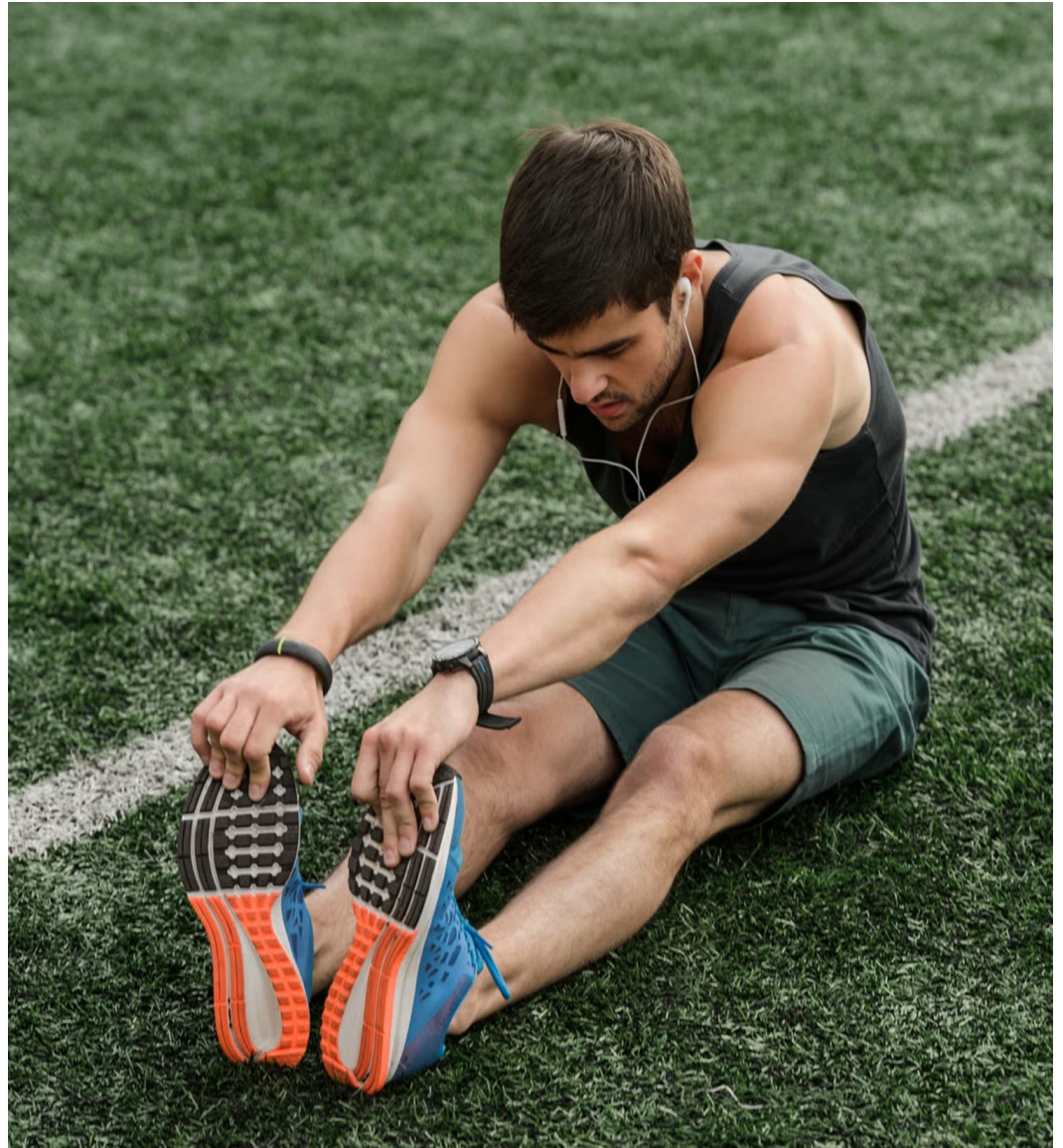
