Bible Story: Ruth Ruth 1-4

Big Idea: God deserves our thanks

Focus: God deserves our thanks even when things are hard

Memory Verse: "Give thanks to the Lord, because he is good. His faithful

love continues forever" Psalm 136:1 (NirV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Ruth 1-4, Psalm 16:7-8; Psalm 34:1-4; Habakkuk 3:17-19, 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

During the Judges era, famine struck, leading Elimelech to move his family to Moab, where he and his sons died. Left with her sons' wives, Ruth and Orpah, Naomi decided to return to Judah. Orpah left, but Ruth vowed to stay with Naomi. Struggling in Bethlehem, Ruth gleaned in Boaz's field. Boaz, a relative, offered kindness. As a kinsman-redeemer, Boaz married Ruth. They had a son, Obed, bringing joy to Naomi.

Life is sometimes hard. Naomi & Ruth had some very hard times, but God was with them through it all. He provided food for them to eat and eventually added to their family. Their family line was in Jesus' genealogy. When we go through pain, God is with us through it all and still works out His good plan.

He Question: Why does God always deserve to be praised?

God is sovereign over all. He always deserves our praise for who He is. He is good, just, holy, loving, and He sits on the throne.

We Question: Does God care about my hurt?

God created us and our emotions. Jesus experienced hurt, making it possible for Him to understand us. God is not far away from our pain. He is mighty enough to understand and be with us.

Me Question: What does God want me to know about Him, and what does this mean for my life?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.





Before you get in the car, write a note that says, "God deserves our thanks, even when things are hard!" Put that note somewhere in the car where your child will see it every time they get in the car. Let this be a reminder for your whole family that when you go through hard times, and don't know what to do, God is always with you and deserves your thanks.





DAY 1

READ "Give thanks to the Lord, because he is good. His faithful love continues forever". Psalm 136:1 (NIrV)

To review the memory verse, grab at least one family member and a ball. You can sit on the floor several feet apart or sit across from each other at a table. Roll the ball back and forth to each other. Each time you roll the ball to the other person, say one word of the verse. Keep rolling it back and forth until you have said the whole verse out loud. If you mess up and say the wrong word, you have to restart!

When that becomes easy, add in a timer, and see how fast you can say it together while rolling the ball back and forth. Try and beat your record each

READ Psalm 16:7-8 (NirV)

READ Ruth 1-4 (NirV)

In the Bible story this week, you learned about Ruth. Ruth struggled and went through some tough situations, but no matter what happened, she always stayed faithful to God. She learned to give thanks to God even when things were hard for her.

READ Psalm 34: 1-4 (NirV)
