Bible Story: Samson Judges 13-16

Big Idea: I can always trust God

Focus: I can always trust God's faithfulness

Memory Verse: "Lord, those who know you will trust in you. You have never

deserted those who look to you."" Psalm 9:10 (NIrV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Judges 13-16, 2 Timothy 2:13; Lamentations 3:22–23; 1 John 1:9

God raised up a leader named Samson during the time the Israelites were oppressed by the Philistines. Samson was dedicated to God from birth and chosen to help deliver the Israelites from the Philistines. Samson turned from God's plans and did things his own way. He fell in love with Delilah. Delilah worked with the Philistines to discover Samson's great strength. Samson ended up captured, but God ultimately used him to destroy the Philistine leaders. God was faithful to what He said He would do.

He Question: Can anything change God's faithfulness to His people? God keeps His promises, no matter what. Because He loves His people so much, He does allow consequences for sin.

We Question: What can we do when we are not faithful to God?

When we mess up, we can choose to either continue to do things our own way or we can choose to ask God for forgiveness and turn back to Him.

Me Question: How is God inviting me to respond?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

As you get your child ready to leave for school, ask your child to look outside at the sunrise. Remind your child that every morning the sun rises. No matter what happened the day before, the sun always rises each morning. They can trust the sun to rise every morning. Explain to your child that the sunrise is similar to God's faithfulness. Just like they can trust that the sun will rise each morning, they can also trust that God is always faithful.





DAY 1

READ Psalm 9:10 (NIrV)

This is the memory verse for the month of September! All month long we are learning that we can trust God.

DAY 2

READ "Even if we are not faithful, He remains faithful. He must be true to Himself." 2 Timothy 2:13 (NirV)

This week you learned what it means to walk by faith. Walking by faith means trusting that God is good, God loves you, and God has plans for you. When we choose to follow and obey Him, things always go better. But, because we don't always make the wise choice, there will be times when we choose to do things our way instead of God's way. When we do that, we can either continue to choose our own way or we can choose to stop, ask God for forgiveness, and turn back to Him. He will forgive us and will always be faithful to us, even when we aren't faithful to Him.

What is one way you have seen God's faithfulness to you lately? Write it on the foot as a reminder that you can always trust God's faithfulness.



DAY 3

READ Judges 13-16 (NirV)

In the Bible story this week, you learned about Samson. God had amazing plans for Samson. God set him apart to lead the Israelites to freedom from the Philistines. But over time, Samson turned away from God's plans. He was unfaithful to God. Even though Samson was unfaithful to God, God was always faithful to him. God never stopped loving Samson, and He was faithful and kept His promise to Samson.

Ask a parent or sibling to play a game with you. Then, find some paper and markers. Take turns playing Hangman by using the following words from this week's Bible story.

READ "But God is faithful and fair. If we confess our sins, He will forgive our sins. He will forgive every wrong thing we have done. He will make us pure." 1 John 1:9 (NirV)
