Bible Story: Joseph and His Brothers Genesis 42-45

Big Idea: I can trust God no matter what

Focus: I can trust God to work all things for good

Memory Verse: "God's way is perfect. The Lord's word doesn't have any

flaws." Psalm 18:30a (NIrV)

### **Bible Story Summary:**

Read and meditate on Genesis 42-45, Romans 8:28, Jeremiah 29:11, Isaiah 55:8-9

After his brothers sold him into slavery and he landed in prison, Joseph ended up second in command of all of Egypt. He was put in charge of preparing food for a coming famine. His brothers came to get food for their families. They didn't recognize Joseph. He tested them before revealing who he was. The brothers were terrified Joseph would punish them, but Joseph told them that what they intended for evil, God used for good. The family was reunited and the brothers learned that God had used Joseph's terrible circumstances to save the people.

### He Question: Does God always turn bad things into good?

Bad things happen because our world is broken by sin. Some things look like they will never be better, but God is greater. He uses everything for His perfect plan to redeem His people and to bring glory to Himself.

### We Question: Why don't we always understand what God is doing?

God knows everything. We do not. We can trust that His promises are always true and His plan is always best, even when we don't understand.

Me Question: What does God want me to know about Him, and what does this mean for my life?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

Have you ever made lemonade before? There are three ingredients you need to make lemonade: water, lemons, and sugar. What would happen if you made lemonade that didn't have any sugar in it? It probably wouldn't taste very good! Good thing you can add sugar to the lemons and water to make delicious lemonade. Our lives can feel a lot like the sugarless lemonade sometimes. Sometimes life can feel hard or confusing. As a family discuss how God can use those tough or bad times to make something good.







**READ** "God's way is perfect. The Lord's Word doesn't have any flaws." Psalm 18:30a (NIrV)

We have been learning this verse all month! You're going to play a fun game today to practice the memory verse again.

Find a piece of paper and a regular marker. Start by writing the memory verse on the paper. Say the verse after it is written down. Then randomly pick two words to remove. Completely color over the two words, so you can't see the words. Now try to say the memory verse with those two words missing.

Next, color over two more words. Then try to say the memory verse again. Continue to color over two words at a time, while trying to say the memory verse each time, until all of the words of the memory verse are gone.

How many times did you say the memory verse?

**READ** "I know the plans I have for you,' announces the Lord. 'I want you to enjoy success. I do not plan to harm you. I will give you hope for the years to come."

Jeremiah 29:11 (NIrV)

Find a cup somewhere in your house. It can be a plastic cup or a paper cup. Once you have a cup, put it on a counter or table so the open side is facing down. Then put a finger on the bottom edge of the cup. See if you can flip the cup, so the open part is facing up, by pushing the bottom edge of the cup with your finger. Try this a few times until you're able to flip the cup.

How many times did you flip the cup to make it work? \_

It was probably fairly hard to flip that cup over! Sometimes our lives can be like that cup. Sometimes we face tough situations in life that aren't easy to just flip around. We can't always flip around the situation to make it better. In those moments, remember that God knows all things. You can trust that even when you don't know why something is happening, God does!

### READ Genesis 42-45 (NIrV)

In our Bible story this week, we learned about Joseph. Joseph lived a hard life. He was betrayed by his family and spent years as a slave in Egypt. The time that Joseph spent as a slave probably made no sense to him. But in the end, God worked it out for good. He forgave his family and was reunited with his family!
