Bible Story: Adam & Eve Genesis 2:8-17, 3:1-24

Big Idea: I can trust God no matter what

Focus: I can trust God because He loves me

Memory Verse: "God's way is perfect. The Lord's word doesn't have any

flaws." Psalm 18:30a (NIrV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Genesis 2:8-17, 3:1-24, 1 John 4:19; Romans 5:8; 1 John 3:1

God created a perfect world where people were in a perfect relationship with Him. He warned the first people, Adam and Eve, not to eat from a certain tree. A serpent tempted Eve, and she and Adam ate fruit from the tree. They became separated from God. They were no longer perfect, and everything was broken. They hid from God in shame, but the Lord did not leave them without hope. He promised a Savior who would defeat the serpent and free all people from the power of sin.

He Question: How is God different from people?

God rules over all things. He is holy and perfect. People sin, but God never does. Sin separates people from Him. However, God is greater than all things and has a deep love for His people.

We Question: How does God show He loves people?

God loves us so much that He planned from the beginning to provide a Savior so we could be with Him forever.

Me Question: What does God want me to know about Him, and what does this mean for my life?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

READ "God's way is perfect. The Lord's Word doesn't have any flaws." Psalm 18:30a (NIrV)

This is the memory verse for the month. This month you are learning that you can trust God no matter what happens. He loves you so much, and He is always with you.

Take some time to find a fun "Summer" way to work on memorizing the memory verse. Maybe you could spell it out with chalk on your driveway. Or you could take a walk and say the verse as you pass each house. You could also say it as you jump over a sprinkler several times.

Memorizing this verse will help you remember that you can always trust God.

READ "See what amazing love the Father has given us! Because of it, we are called children of God. And that's what we really are! The world doesn't know us because it didn't know Him." 1 John 3:1(NirV)

After Adam and Eve disobeyed God, they made the situation even worse by hiding from God. Imagine— thinking that they could hide from the one who had CREATED them! At least when God came looking for them, they admitted what they had done. God still loved them, just like He still loves us when we mess up and sin.

Don't think that you can ever hide from God—He knows what you've done and what is best for you. You can trust Him because He will always love you!

READ Genesis 3:1-24 (NIrV)

Things got a lot harder for Adam and Eve after they disobeyed God. They left a perfect garden and were living in the big, scary world. But God still forgave Adam and Eve when they disobeyed Him. He didn't turn His back on them like He could have. He kept taking care of them because He loved them.

Sometimes we learn our lesson the hard way. We disobey God, and there are hard consequences. But no matter what, God loves us so much! That's why He is always willing to forgive us of our sins. That is why Jesus died; to pay the price for every one of our sins.
