PARENT CORNER weekly TODAY: OCTOBER 4-5

Bible Story: Israel's First King 1 Samuel 8:1–9: 13:1–14, 15:10–29

Big Idea: God is King

Focus: God is the One True King

Memory Verse: "Who is he, this King of glory? The Lord who rules over all!

He is the King of glory." Psalm 24:10 (NirV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on 1 Samuel 8:1-9; 13:1-14, 15:10-29, Daniel 7:14; Psalm 47:7-8: Proverbs 3:5-6

God wanted to be Israel's King, but they demanded an earthly king like the other nations. King Saul was chosen to lead them. When Saul led the Israelites into battle against the Philistines, he became frightened and disobeyed God. King Saul viewed himself as the ultimate authority in Israel, and this upset God. Samuel, one of God's judges, tried to help Saul and the Israelites, but Saul still didn't listen. Because he disobeyed God and forgot that God is the One True King, Saul had to face consequences and his time as king came to an end.

He Question: Can anyone take the place of God?

God can accomplish His plan through His people, but no one can be as great as Him. God is the One True King.

We Question: What if I want to be in charge of my own life?

God allows us to choose if we want to do things His way or our own way. He loves us no matter what, but because He is the One True King, His way is always best for us.

Me Question: How is God inviting me to respond?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

As your child gets ready for bed, ask your child the following questions. Would you like to be the queen or king for the day? What would you do if you were the king or queen for a day? Take turns sharing your answers. When you have both answered the questions, remind your child that there is only one true King, and that is God! Pray together and thank God for being the One True King.







READ "Who is he, this King of glory? The Lord who rules over all! He is the King of glory. Psalm 24:10 (NirV)



READ Proverbs 3:5-6 (NirV)

Close your eyes and picture a queen or king in your head. When you close your eyes, what do you see? Do you see someone who looks royal? Is your king or queen wearing anything specific? How do you know they are a king or queen? What makes them a king or a queen?

Now close your eyes and picture God. What does your picture of God look like? Does He look like a king to you. When you think about God, does He look the same as the picture of the king that you were just thinking about? He probably doesn't. He doesn't wear a fancy robe or have a gold crown on His head.

God may not look like the king you imagined, but He is the One True King! Take a moment and pray to God. Thank Him for always being able to trust Him and for always being the One True King.
