Bible Story: The Walls of Jericho Joshua 1:1–3; 5:13–6:27

Big Idea: I can always trust God

Focus: I can always trust God's instructions

Memory Verse: : "Lord, those who know you will trust in you. You have never

deserted those who look to you." Psalm 9:10 (NIrV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Joshua 1:1-3; 5:13-6:27, Psalm 25:4-5; Isaiah 30:21; Joshua 1:9

Joshua was the leader of God's people. One day, the Commander of the Lord's Army came to Joshua and told him to take off his shoes because the place where he was standing was holy. God gave Joshua unusual instructions to defeat Jericho. Joshua trusted God and led the army to follow God's instructions. On the seventh day the walls of the city fell. God led His people to victory

He Question: What kind of leader is God?

God is a wise leader who always does what is best and knows what is best because He is sovereign over all and loves His people deeply. He fights for His people and has a perfect plan.

We Question: How do we follow God when it doesn't make sense?

We can trust that God is a good leader even if we don't understand why His way is best for us. He will always lead us to do what is best for His plan.

Me Question: What does God want me to know about Him, and what does this mean for my life?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.





As you prepare to make dinner tonight, find a recipe for one part of your meal. As a family, work together to follow the instructions to make that dish. When you finish, enjoy the delicious dish that your family made. Take a moment and talk about how the dish turned out well because you followed the instructions. Explain that just like the dish had good instructions, God has good instructions for you as well.

READ "Lord, those who know you will trust in you. You have never deserted those who look to you." Psalm 9:10 (NIrV)

This is the memory verse for the month of September! All month long we've been learning that we can trust God. In our Bible story this week Joshua had to trust God as he walked around the walls of Jericho. You can trust God. too!

Find a piece of paper and some tape. Curl the piece of paper into the shape of a horn. Use the tape to tape it together.

Once you have your horn, hold it up to your mouth. Say the memory verse 7 times as you march around a room.

PRACTICE this memory verse as a reminder that you can always trust God

DAY 2

READ "You will hear your teacher's voice behind you. You will hear it whether you turn to the right or to the left. It will say, "Here is the path I want you to take. So walk on it." Isaiah 30:21 (NirV)

Find a parent or sibling who can help you with today's activity. Go into your kitchen and think of a snack to make. It could be a trail mix, a sandwich, or something else yummy. Then, give your parent or sibling step by step instructions that explain how to make that snack. See if they can make the snack you are thinking about by following your instructions.

Was it easy or hard for your parent or sibling to follow your instructions? Hopefully you gave them great instructions. That person probably did a good job making the snack because they trusted you and they followed your instructions. They knew that you weren't going to give them the wrong instructions.

Always remember that God loves you just like your parents or siblings love you. Just like your family member trusted you, know that you can always trust God. God's instructions are always the best! He loves you, He knows you, and you can always trust Him to give you the best instructions.

DAY 3

READ Joshua 1:1-3; 5:13-6:27 (NirV)

In the Bible story this week, you learned about Joshua. God gave Joshua plans to defeat Jericho. The hard part was that God's instructions didn't make sense to Joshua. Even though God's instructions didn't make sense, Joshua chose to trust God. He did what God instructed him to do. In the end, the walls of Jericho fell, and God's people defeated Jericho!

Read the Bible story from this week. Then answer the TRUE or FALSE questions below:

TRUE or FALSE: The priests blew the trumpets for 7 days.

TRUE or FALSE: On the 6th day, they marched around the city 7 times.

TRUE or FALSE: After the priests blew their trumpets on the 7th day, the army stayed quiet
