Bible Story: Ten Commandments Exodus 19-20

Big Idea: I can always trust God

Focus: I can always trust that God's rules are best

Memory Verse: : "Lord, those who know you will trust in you."

Psalm 9-10 (NIrV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Exodus 19-20; Psalm 119:105; James 1:22-25; Matthew 22:36-40

The Israelites lived in captivity in Egypt for 400 years before God miraculously rescued them. They journeyed towards the Promised Land. God called Moses up to Mount Sinai, where He gave Moses laws to show the people how to act toward Him and toward others. He wrote 10 Commandments on a stone for them to obey. The Ten Commandments teach us how to love God and love other people.

He Question: Why is God the One who makes the rules?

God is our Creator and King. He rules the world. Since He created everything, He knows how life works best.

We Question: How do we know what God wants us to do?

God has given us the Bible to show us who He is and how He wants us to live. We can learn more by reading His Word.

Me Question: How is God inviting me to respond?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.



While you are driving, have your child hold up all ten fingers. These ten fingers represent the ten commandments. See if they can remember any of them. Ask them which one might be easy to follow and which might be hard to follow. Remind them that God gave us these rules not to make life hard, but to help make our life easy as we follow Him. He loves us so very much and that's why he gives us rules to follow. Obeying these rules shows him how much we love him and can trust him to know what is best.

READ "Lord, those who know you will trust in you." Psalm 9:10a (NIrV)

READ James 1:22-25 (NIrV)

After you read this verse, find a mirror and look at your reflection. What color shirt are you wearing? What color of eyes do you have? Your reflection is just like God's rules. You can't just know them, you have to remember and follow them. He loves us so much and gave us these rules to help us through life. When we follow these rules, it shows Him how much we love Him and we can trust He knows what is best.

READ Psalm 119:105 (NIrV)

God gave us the Bible to help guide us through day to day life. There are many rules that He has given us to follow. These rules are not to make our day difficult but rather to help us. He loves us so much and because He knows what is best, we can trust Him and try our best to follow them.

This verse talks about how if we follow what He says in the Bible, it will help to light our path. It will guide us through our day. With the help of a parent, draw a picture of yourself in the light that shines from the flashlight.
