YOU ASKED FOR IT!

Over the last few weeks many people have submitted questions they would like to hear a pastor speak about from a biblical perspective. Some of them have come from members of our church. Others have come from those outside the church.

But ALL the questions are great ones! I wish I had adequate time to address each of them. However, I believe everyone will benefit from the questions I've selected for our seven-week series!

So, are you ready for the lineup?

April 7 - Confirmation Sunday - How can I hear God's voice?

How to discern God's will for our lives is one of the most common questions I get asked as a pastor. This week we will help young and old alike discover the ways God speaks to us and how God reveals His will.

April 14 – What should I do with my doubts?

Doubts creep into the hearts of skeptical and devoted followers alike. This week we will explore how to respond to doubts!

April 21 – Graduation Sunday – How should a Christian decide how to vote?

Politics have become incredibly divisive, and many people have turned their back on the church because of perceptions of "Christian Nationalism". This week we will talk about important questions for every Christian to work through as we seek first to be residents of God's Kingdom.

April 28 – What should I know about "the rapture"?

"The Rapture" has been the premise of many books and movies over the last several decades. This week we will discover where this theology comes from and what the Bible actually says!

May 5 - Why does God sanction killing in the Old Testament?

Many people are turned off by the violence sanctioned by God and carried out by God's people in the Old Testament. This week we will seek to understand part of Israel's role in the Old Testament and how Jesus' death on the cross changes everything!

May 12 – How is it okay for women to be pastors?

Our Methodist doctrine supports women in ordained roles, but not every faith tradition believes the same. Each side uses Scripture as their basis. Who's right? This week we will investigate some of the Scriptures in question and share our church's stance!

May 19 - Why do bad things happen to good people?

How can God be good if there is so much pain in the world? Sadly, wrestling with this question has led people to abandon their faith and turn their backs on God. This week we will briefly reflect on our theological understanding of the problem of evil, but more importantly we will spend extended time in prayer and worship – turning to the only one who can bring healing and hope to our pain.

It's my hope that knowing the questions in advance will inspire you to invite friends or family members who would be interested to hear them addressed in church. This series will be a perfect opportunity to live out our mission as we invite people on a *Journey with Jesus*!

UPDATE FROM OUR CHURCH COUNCIL

Our Church Council met on March 12, at the property of the former Saint Jacob Methodist Church. Five years ago, the church closed and donated its property and assets to Troy Methodist as we oversaw the ongoing worship there in Saint Jacob. Despite our investments, the attendance declined to the point that a final worship service was held there in December of 2023. For the last six weeks our council has been in a time of prayer and discernment about what to do with the currently unused property. At our meeting on March 12, our council discerned God's Spirit not leading us to any ministry uses for the building and unanimously voted to form a team to take next steps toward the disposition of the Saint Jacob property and report back to the council at our next meeting on May14, 2024.

SERVE

UPWARD 2024 MISSION PROJECT

Each year the Upward participants, coaches, and families choose a mission project in which everyone can participate. The hope is those involved will learn the values of service and generosity. Last year, they held a toilet paper drive and were able to collect 1,104 rolls which were distributed to three area pantries! This year the group collected paper goods: 990 rolls of toilet paper, 216 rolls of paper towels, and 130 boxes of Kleenex! Because of the generosity of everyone involved, they were able to give to five area pantries! Because these items that we use on a daily basis are not covered by Food Stamps, oftentimes, families go without because they can't afford to purchase these items out of pocket. Through the generous giving this year, area pantries are well stocked so that anyone in need will be provided for.

MISSION MATCHING MOMENT

Equipping the Called is a ministry in our area that provides aid, comfort and relief to children in crisis. It is their goal to provide the most basic of necessities; such as clothing, toiletries, and other personal care items to children who have become displaced from their home. Part of this process includes deep-cleaning donated clothing before distributing the clothes to kids. Currently the ministry relies on external facilities and volunteers to wash donated clothing; but their hope is to raise \$3,000 to fund the purchase of their own washer and dryer. With the purchase of on-site appliances, the ministry will be able to provide clean clothing more efficiently!

The Troy Methodist Mission Team would like to support this fundraiser by encouraging you all to donate funds to the church office marked: Equipping the Called – Washer and Dryer Fund. And we will match up to \$500! This will provide a third of what is needed for this ministry! How exciting it would be to help them in this way. Together, we can make a difference in the lives of deserving children and the organizations that help serve them. NURTURING THE NEXT GENERATION: 5 Bible Tips For Raising Wholesome Kids

Raising kids can be difficult, even on the best days. Thankfully, we have help! The Bible offers valuable guidance to help instill Godly values and virtues in children. By studying the Bible and applying its teachings, parents can raise children who love and serve God wholeheartedly.

Here are 5 Bible verses that can provide guidance to parents:

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 - "And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Hebrews12:11 - "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it."

Deuteronomy 4:9 - "Only take care, and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. Make them known to your children and your children's children."

Proverbs 22:6,15 - "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it... Folly is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of discipline will drive it far away."

Proverbs 11:30 - "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and whoever captures souls is wise."

*It's important to remember that these verses should be read in context and understood within the larger narrative of the Bible.

Helping our children become approved workers, who are unashamed and able to handle the word of truth, can make a positive impact on their lives and those around them. It's important to instill these values in them from a young age so that they may grow up to be responsible and faithful individuals. Raising children can be a challenging and daunting task at times, but the payoff is absolutely worth it.


GRADUATION SUNDAY April 21

DAVID BARR (1961-2024)

It is with a heavy heart that I share this information with you. Our full-time custodian, David Barr, was found deceased in his home Saturday evening, March 16.

Our hearts are grieved by the passing of David. He was an integral part of our staff team for twelve years. He often went above and beyond to ensure that the ministries of our church were served well. David is already missed and will be for a long time.

David was a servant to us all. The most common phrase I heard from him was, "I've got it." Whenever

I tried to help he'd say, "I've got it." Whenever I asked for a particular setup, I'd hear, "I've got it." Whenever I wasn't sure what was needed, but nebulously asked for his help, he'd respond, "I've got it." I will miss those words on so many levels. They reflect the attitude of a servant. I'm so thankful that David has been able to hear Jesus tell him, "Well done good and faithful servant."

We do celebrate that David knew Jesus and lived out his faith in service to our church and his family. In fact, we ask that you join us in prayer for David's mother (with whom he lived) as she struggles with dementia. And please also pray for his family who are not only dealing with David's unexpected death but are now trying to figure out how to best care for his mother.
