A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

WHAT I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO FOR OUR CHURCH IN 2024

It's been a while since I've been as excited to start a new year as I am for 2024! The last several years have been filled with the challenges of COVID and denominational turmoil, and I'm sure this year will have its own challenges; but I'm expecting God to do great things in us and through us in 2024. I'm prayerfully anticipating this will be a year marked with:

Growth – Of course we would all love to see our church continue to grow numerically but the growth I'm speaking of is in US! I have been seeing amazing spiritual growth happening in our kids, students, and participants in journey groups, bands, and our Spiritual Leadership Generator. I anticipate a deepening of our love for God and neighbor catalyzed by our commitment to discipleship. If you want to be part of that growth, join a group in 2024!

Ministry – Everything we do is ministry, but I'm specifically referring to our commitment to providing a few Sundays in 2024 where we will have extended times of ministry – prayer, worship, healing, and testimony. 



p.m. — and conclude at 8:45 p.m. as usual.

FOCUS ON GOD'S LOVE THIS MONTH

Valentine's Day is just around the corner. It can be a great opportunity for Christian families to focus on love and express gratitude for God's love. Traditionally, this one day of the year shows how much love there is in the world. But what happens after the chocolate is eaten and the flowers wilt? And should we even celebrate this day?

We should celebrate because God created us to love, to express that love to others, and to receive love. He set the greatest example of love, giving up His only son for us. Romans 5:8 shows us "...God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Because of His great love for us, we should share that love as well. After all, the Word says in John 13:35 that the world will know us by our love for one another. Scripture overflows with references to God's great, enduring, and abounding love. I John 4, for example, details the depth of God's love and his commandment to *love others*. Valentine's Day gives us that opportunity to show love to not just family but to friends, neighbors, and more.

Now that we know why we should celebrate this day, how do you create Valentine's Day traditions that will have a longer-lasting impact on your family and the people around you? Here are just a few ways we can make an impact on not just our own families but the community around us.

- + Gather as a family and read scriptures that speak about love and God's love for us
- ★ Rethink gifts. Valentine's gifts should never just be about buying something for the sake of buying something. Scripture says that we should not store up earthly treasures (Matthew 6:19-21). Make this about the heart-to-heart expressions that build intimacy and connection. That means handmade cards, extra time together, or massages. If you must buy a gift, choose it using the GIFT test: does it create more Gratitude, Insight or Intimacy, Fondness, and Trust between you? Otherwise, is it to impress or 'spoil' someone?
- ◆ Create handmade Valentine's Day cards and share them with family members, friends, neighbors, and coworkers with messages of love and encouragement. One of my favorite ways to do this is to give someone a "Heart Attack." In the days leading up to Valentine's Day, leave a love note on your child's (or loved one's) bedroom doors every day. Make sure that the notes are character traits and specific things that you love about that person. By the 14th, their door is covered with reasons you love that special person!
- → Tuck little construction paper hearts with love notes into your family member's backpack, lunch, or jacket pocket for them to find throughout the day. Leave little surprises for your friends or coworkers.
- → Plan a special Valentine's Day dinner instead of going out to a busy restaurant. After dinner, you could go to church as a family or consider volunteering with the Youth at church. (Valentine's Day falls on Wednesday night this year)

Showing love needn't be that involved. Call someone you haven't talked to in a while, send a greeting card, hold a door open, or even listen with a compassionate ear and heart—all these gestures communicate and show love. Remember the marginalized people; think about the lonely elderly neighbor, the struggling widow, the discontent teen, or someone from your church who may be lonely and enjoy some cheering up.

This upcoming Valentine's Day, consider the endless possibilities. Make new traditions that can have a lasting impact all year long. Let your words and actions flow from a Christ-filled heart. Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. (1 John 4:7)
