A MESSAGE FROM CHURCH LEADERSHIP

AN UPDATE FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

Membership Vote on Disaffiliation from UMC--January 22, 2023

Church Family,

BACKGROUND: As you know from our June 17, 2022 letter, the Church Council formed a Transition Team last year to review various options for our church related to the impending United Methodist Church (UMC) split. On June 14 (after months of meetings, information gathering, conversations and prayer), the Transition Team recommended to the Church Council that we seek disaffiliation from the UMC and potential affiliation with the Global Methodist Church (GMC). The Church Council approved both recommendations unanimously, understanding that the final decision lies with the Troy UMC membership. In addition, the Church Council formed a Disaffiliation Team to represent us in discussions with the Illinois Great Rivers Conference (IGRC) regarding specifics of disaffiliation from the UMC.

The Church Council didn't take these actions lightly. For many of us, the UMC has been our denominational home for years. We've accomplished much good as part of the UMC family and potential departure from the UMC involves a sense of loss. Nonetheless, the broader UMC is trending in a direction that challenges our faith convictions as a church body and allows practices that conflict with UMC doctrine as currently stated in the UMC Book of Discipline. We are convinced the future vision of the UMC denomination is not the future we would want for Troy United Methodist Church. On the other hand, we are excited about potential affiliation with the GMC, which would affirm our faith convictions and represent a compelling vision for future discipleship and evangelism. The GMC lines up strongly with our current faith practices and ministry at Troy UMC.

<u>NEW INFORMATION</u>: For months, our Disaffiliation Team waited for the Conference to meet with us to discuss costs and other terms of disaffiliation. We recognize the waiting was frustrating for everyone. The good news is our Disaffiliation Team and the Conference Team finally met on December 11th and agreed on a total exit cost of \$643,437 (of which \$224,712 has already been paid or budgeted for 2023). The cost breakdown is as follows:

Apportionments (2022 = \$119,028; 2023 = \$105,684) Unfunded Pension Liability (\$371,051) Property and Assets (\$47,674)

Note: The 2022 apportionments have already been paid, leaving a balance due of \$524,409. The 2023 apportionments are budgeted for next year and would have to be paid whether we stay or leave the UMC. After subtracting all the apportionments, the additional cost to disaffiliate is actually \$418,725, which is substantially lower than we expected when we began this process back in June. The bulk of this remaining amount consists of unfunded pension liability, much of which we would pay over several years if we remain in the UMC. When disaffiliating, we have to pay this cost up front. Finally, by disaffiliating from the UMC our church will own all our property, buildings and financial assets—which the Conference currently owns and holds in trust.

Having reached an agreement with the Conference on terms of disaffiliation, we have scheduled a date/time/location of **Sunday**, **January 22**, **2023 at 3:00 p.m. in the Family Life Center** for a church vote on disaffiliation from the UMC. If disaffiliation is approved, we will then hold a vote on affiliation with the GMC. Disaffiliation from the UMC requires a 2/3 vote for approval. Affiliation with the GMC requires a majority vote for approval. To be eligible to vote, you must be present and a member of Troy UMC. Each church member will receive official notification of the date/time/location of the vote. Childcare will be available during the church conference. RSVP to Christine@troyumc.org.

<u>PREPARATION FOR THE VOTE</u>: We have updated the FAQs, which provide a lot of useful information and answer many questions. We strongly encourage you to read them at http://troyumc.org/faq

In addition, everyone is invited to come to one of two <u>informational meetings</u> to ask questions and understand the specifics of leaving the UMC and aligning with the GMC (meeting details provided separately in this newsletter).

Whereas the informational meetings are question & answer sessions, members may also sign up for a <u>small discussion forum</u> for an opportunity to express feelings and opinions (forum details provided separately in this newsletter).

Finally, we urge you to be in prayer for the long-awaited church vote and the future of our church.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

How to Prepare for this Important Vote

"When are we going to vote?" That's been the number one question I've received over the last 6 months! Well, the time is finally upon us for you, our membership, to determine the future direction of our local church. Our leaders have been working behind the scenes in some form or fashion to prepare for this vote since 2018. That prayerful preparation culminated in June with our church council unanimously affirming disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church and affiliation with the Global Methodist Church. Now that an agreement has been reached with our conference, the matter is in your hands. I simply want to offer three things that can help you prepare you for our congregational vote on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>January 22</u>, <u>2023 at 3 p.m. in the Family Life Center</u>.

Attend an <u>Informational Meeting</u>: All members and attenders are invited to learn more at one of our two Informational Meetings. These meetings will include a presentation from our transition team on disaffiliation from the UMC and affiliation with the GMC, as well as time for questions and answers. These meetings are purely informational and are not designed to be opportunities to make personal statements about the matters at hand.

- Sunday, January 15 at 3:30 p.m.

Sign up for a **Discussion Forum**: Any member or regular attender of Troy UMC who desires to share his/her feelings or opinions in a personal statement is invited to sign up for one of (at least) four discussion forums in the Sanctuary. These forums are each limited to 25 people to allow for anyone, and everyone present to share their heart. I will be present along with members of our leadership to listen and have open discussion. Call the church office (618-667-6241) or go online to www.troyumc.org/faq to register for a spot. These are first come, first serve. Please only sign up for one forum. If demand is high, we will offer more!

Finally, I invite you join in a <u>Season of Prayer and Fasting</u>. Let us all seek God for direction ahead of this important vote by:

- Fasting from food one day each week between now and January 22
- Praying this daily prayer: "Lord, lead us into the future you intend for our church."

Throughout the next few weeks, you will receive encouragement from our prayer team led by council members, Wenifer Greer and Rita Brandt, as we open our hearts to God's direction for our church.





SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP GENERATOR – A great investment for 2023!

Learn what it means to be a spiritual leader and live into your calling!

The **Spiritual Leadership Generator** is a process for developing everyday followers of Jesus into spiritual leaders. That means YOU. We'll look at biblical leadership through the life of Christ and dive into leadership concepts that can be directly applied to your life. Completing this course will help you:

- Integrate your learnings spiritually, relationally, emotionally, and vocationally.
- Develop your spiritual leadership.
- · Sharpen your leadership skills.
- See your call and begin to embody your call.

Details:

- 5 modules over 10 months in a cohort of 5 people (we'll take a short summer break)
- Weekly 90-minute meetings video and discussion + application and accountability (your group can meet at any time during the week)
- 2 one-day retreats worship, formation, relationship, vision casting Kickoff on Friday, January 27th (tentatively 9 a.m. 3 p.m. with lunch at TUMC)
