

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Everyone Can Participate in our MISSION!

Our mission at Troy Methodist Church is to Invite people on a journey with Jesus! I love our mission for a couple of very specific reasons. First, the journey with Jesus implies that nobody has arrived. Everyone is welcome on that journey whether they're just beginning or have been a Christ follower for decades! The other reason I love our mission is that each of us has an active part to play. **We INVITE!**

Or do we? When was the last time you invited someone to attend worship with you? It's not always easy to invite others to join you in church. First you have to have someone to invite. Then you have to step out of your comfort zone and risk the potential awkwardness. Next you need to come up with what exactly you're going to say and what you're going to invite them to! These are all common barriers that prevent each of us from participating in our mission, but it's my hope that as we approach Easter each one of us will get over the hump and join in this critical part of our church's mission. Here's how:

- If you don't already have people in mind that you can invite, begin praying NOW, "Lord, who would you have me invite to Easter worship?" Consider inviting family, friends without church homes, neighbors, co-workers, classmates, or people you meet while out and about!
- Regarding your comfort zone remember, you never grow when you stay where you're comfortable. And what
 greater joy is there than being part of someone's story of finding new hope in Christ? Our comfort zones are
 worth risking so others can encounter Jesus!
- But here's where our church staff will help make your invitation easier! We are going to provide small, business sized, invite cards for you to use to invite people to one of our three Easter Worship services on March 31. We will have those available in the next couple of weeks.
- Furthermore, we will be starting a new message series on April 14 designed specifically for you to invite others to attend with you. In fact, both YOU and THEY will be able to help design the topics. We're calling it, You Asked For It! You can fill out the short survey here: https://forms.gle/qEPjepQQb5e6NhSm9 You can also share this survey on your Facebook page or email it to friends you'd like to invite to worship with you.

You and I cannot control if someone will take us up on our invitation. All we can do is be faithful and participate in our mission by doing the inviting. Most people who come to church come because they were invited by a friend. And over 80% of people who don't have a church home say they'd probably attend if a friend asked them! But one thing I know for sure – none of us would be journeying with Jesus if we weren't first invited!

The Rev. Dr. Joel P. Catlin graduated from Springfield High School, The University of Indianapolis, Christian Theological Seminary, and in 2001 received a Doctor of Ministry from Asbury Theological Seminary in the field of Church Growth, Evangelism and Missions.

For much of the last 50 years, Joel has specialized in Christian Theater, alongside his wife, the Rev. Donna Catlin. Early in their clergy careers they started the Theatre Ministry, "Christian Arts Productions" and itinerated as Christian Dramatists. Joel has performed in hundreds of productions throughout the Midwest. He is widely known for his over 300 portrayals of the famous circuit rider, Peter Cartwright. Dr. Catlin was extensively involved in church camping. His most recent publication is through Cokesbury in that arena.

After 40 plus years of active ministry, the Catlins retired in Highland, Illinois. They love traveling and spending time together at home with friends and family. Dr. Catlin enjoys his hobbies of writing, art, fishing, hunting, boating, wilderness camping, and all things outdoors. Joel is also a passionate District Captain in The Convention of States Movement.

The Catlins have three wonderful adult sons and daughters-in-law. They have 8 amazing grandchildren who have priority over much of their time.


