



A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

THE HEART OF REVIVAL

If you haven't heard by now, rumblings of revival have been shaking college campuses across the United States in the last few weeks. The epicenter? Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky. What began as a simple chapel service on February 8 caught fire and (as of this writing) has not ceased. Some students stayed and prayed and were joined by dozens, then hundreds, then thousands in the days since. Their prayer and worship haven't stopped. In fact, it's attracted so many people hungering and thirsting for God from across the country that the worship has expanded to various chapels across the street at Asbury Theological Seminary (where I spent several years) and to local churches. I've had many close friends stop all



plans to travel to Asbury to experience this move of God. Our own Tim and Ruby Price were there for a few hours on day two of what news outlets and Christian commentators are calling a revival. Troy UMC member, Noah Durbin, a student at Asbury Seminary, has been there and experienced the powerful presence of God in healing ways too.

Countless people have reflected on this movement of God. Some have been skeptical, questioning its validity – even calling it emotionalism. However, I'm not questioning it for a moment as the first-hand accounts from close friends (and bandmates) have confirmed what I've observed from afar – that this began and continues to be a genuine movement of worship and prayer by people (mostly students) who are hungry for God. I love it and hope it continues to spread. As I write this, tears are coming to my eyes as I imagine how many people have come to know Jesus, been delivered from addictions, found forgiveness and healing, and felt God's call to vocational ministry. I believe people will talk about this awakening for decades to come and that the rumblings will be felt for generations.

I offer one thought. Although I wasn't there, I've seen that first chapel service that started it all. There was nothing flashy. No big band or magnificent worship songs. The preacher was a normal guy. He simply made a call for genuine confession and repentance and a young lady shared a touching testimony of her need for God. About 20-30 students came to the altar to pray as a response. They came with repentant hearts longing for the healing touch of God. That's it. Nothing out of the "ordinary" and yet, whenever God's people come to him with sincere confession of sin and repentance (turning from sin toward God), the supernatural power of God pours over us. There is nothing "ordinary" about that.

Today, I simply ask you to consider if you're regularly coming to God with a genuine attitude of confession and repentance. Do you hunger for more of God? If so, we can expect a supernatural spirit of revival and awakening to take place in us and in our church. May it be so.

IMPORTANT UPDATES ON OUR DENOMINATIONAL FUTURE

Your Membership

Many people have asked how our disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church affects their membership. Part of the agreement with our conference is that we would report each of our members' intentions regarding membership. It is our hope that everyone will choose to remain part of our local church family and thereby have your membership transfer to the Global Methodist Church. But we need to hear from you! **Be on the lookout for an email requesting your response arriving soon.** If we don't hear from you, we will follow up with a written letter. If we still don't hear from you, per our agreement with our conference, your membership will be automatically transferred to Saint John's United Methodist Church in Edwardsville.

Special Offering to offset Disaffiliation Costs

Our disaffiliation agreement with our conference requires us to pay \$524,409 (for a breakdown, see www.troyumc.org/faq). Although this is a significant amount of money we anticipate making it up in 5-7 years without increasing our annual budget. However, we are asking everyone to **prayerfully consider a one-time sacrificial gift in March or April to help offset these costs**. You may continue making checks out to "Troy United Methodist Church" and put "Disaffiliation" in the memo. You may also make a gift online at www.troyumc.org/give. Thank you for your generosity and helping us step confidently into a new future!

New Church Name

Several have inquired about our church's new name. What will we be called? At their last meeting, our church council created a team to seek input from the congregation and make a recommendation for a new name by April. **So, this is your opportunity to share your thoughts and ideas!** Please email them to newname@troyumc.org before Sunday, **March 12**. The team will narrow down the ideas and come to the congregation later in March to vote on your favorite. Remember, we remain Troy United Methodist Church until the specially called session of annual conference approves our disaffiliation on May 6, 2023.





