

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

ADAPTIVE LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

Our Adaptive Leadership Team is nearing the end of its first big objective – to produce a Ministry Action Plan (MAP) for our congregation by the end of 2025. Thus far, we have spent time considering our external and internal context, affirmed our mission of *Inviting people on a journey with Jesus*, and articulated our core values which we shared with the congregation in August: Methodist Heritage, Scriptural Authority, Life Transformation, Spirit-Led Ministry, Outward Witness, and Every Person Matters.

The last three months we have narrowed in on our Vision – our hoped-for and preferred future as we carry out our mission. We believe God's vision for us is *Passionate Disciples Multiplying Passionate Disciples* and we have some near-term objectives for the next 18 months of clearly defining what makes a passionate disciple and aligning our ministry teams to our church's MAP. Our final task this year, which is already underway, is to clarify our church's discipleship system and strategies. Please continue to pray for our work as we meet in November and December to finalize our MAP!

ROOF & RESTROOMS RENOVATION

For the last month you've been hearing about our Roof and Restrooms Renovation! I continue to be thankful for the blessing of our facilities and the generosity of our congregation.

As we approach our Giving Sunday, November 16, I hope that we can collectively make a way for these projects to all be funded. The roof is an obvious necessity, and the restrooms facelift will make an immediate impact for not only our congregation but for all the hospitality we offer the community. SHARE THANKSGIVING 2025

Share Thanksgiving is a great opportunity for each of us to help others in our community share in a traditional Thanksgiving meal. By donating a full meal or one or more meal components, you will assist those who are not able to purchase these holiday foods on their own.

FIRST STEP:

On November 2, 9, and 16, you can sign up to bring an entire meal or one or more meal components listed below by filling out a sign-up form, which will be distributed each week. On Sunday, November 23 all items need to be brought to church. We will compile meals for delivery that morning. *Meal components:* turkey (frozen), rolls and stuffing, vegetables and sides, desserts

WHAT DO I BRING?

The idea is that you bring items that you enjoy cooking for your own Thanksgiving meal. If you usually make pumpkin pie for dessert, we suggest a can of pumpkin pie mix (including spices), a pie crust mix, and Cool Whip or Dream Whip. Some of you have used your creativity to include a favorite casserole recipe with all the ingredients as a side dish.

SUGGESTIONS & IDEAS

Vegetables/side dishes: Potatoes (fresh bag of potatoes or box of mashed potatoes mix), gravy (glass jar or packet), canned vegetables, canned yams, your favorite recipe with ingredients (green bean casserole, candied yams, etc.)

Desserts: pie mix, crust mix, Cool Whip, cookies, cake mix, your favorite recipe with ingredients

OUT OF TOWN?

Will you be out of town the Sunday before Thanksgiving? You can still arrange to get your items to the church by dropping them off during office hours the week prior. We do ask that you carefully label your items with your name and whatever meal components you are providing.

HOW MANY PER MEAL?

While it is difficult to predict the sizes of the families for whom items will be provided, we ask that you bring enough to feed a family of four. We can make adjustments as we compile the meals, as needed.

HOW CAN I HELP?

DELIVER MEALS! Deliverers head off in their own vehicle with addresses in hand, and we have maps of Troy available if needed. We also have some instructions should you not reach someone at home.

BRING FOOD! Either meal components or an entire meal

PRAY for the families receiving meals

Remember that soap is no longer allowed in the shoeboxes. For a full list of restricted items go to the Operation Christmas Child website. As you pack your box, remember to pray over it and reflect on the fact that each shoebox is a chance to show the love of Christ to a child. Giving to others is one of the greatest gifts of the Christmas season, and it points us back to the greatest gift: the Christ child!

Guarding Your Family's Peace This Holiday Season By Jenn Diliberto

The holiday season should be filled with joy and connection, but for many families it can bring stress or tension. As parents and caregivers, we have a responsibility to protect our family's peace and set a Christlike example — even when that means making hard choices.

1. Don't Let Toxic People Control Your Schedule

Proverbs 4:23 says, "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it." Guarding your heart means guarding your family's peace. Don't let unhealthy relationships decide how you spend your time. Kids are learning from how you set boundaries and choose calm over conflict.

2. Prioritize Worship and Godly Community

In the busyness of the season, make space for church and time with people who lift you up in prayer. Hebrews 10:24–25 reminds us to keep meeting together and to encourage one another toward love and good deeds. Choose spaces that strengthen your family's faith.

3. Choose Peace Over Proving a Point

When tensions rise, remember that peace is powerful. Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers" (Matthew 5:9). Turning the other cheek doesn't mean accepting mistreatment — it means responding with grace instead of anger. Your children will remember how you handled hard moments more than who "won" the conversation.

4. Keep Perspective

Not every moment will go as planned, and that's okay. Focus on what truly matters — loving your family well, honoring the Lord, and reflecting His peace. Philippians 4:7 promises, "The peace of God...will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

This season, choose peace over pressure and presence over perfection. Your children will remember the warmth in your home more than any event on the calendar.
