MARK 8:27-38 (THE INCLUSIVE BIBLE)

Mark 8:27-30 - Then Jesus and the disciples set out for the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way, Jesus asked the disciples this question: "Who do people say that I am?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptizer; others, Elijah; still others, one of the prophets." "And you," he went on to ask, "who do you say that I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Messiah!" But Jesus gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

Mark 8:31-33 - Then Jesus began to teach them that the Promised One had to suffer much, be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and religious scholars, be put to death, and rise again three days later. Jesus said these things quite openly. Peter then took Jesus aside and began to take issue with him. At this, Jesus turned around and, eyeing the disciples, reprimanded Peter: "Get out of my sight, you Satan! You are judging by human standards rather than by God's!"

Mark 8:34-38 - Jesus summoned the crowd and the disciples and said, "If you wish to come after me, you must deny your very self, take up your cross and follow in my footsteps. If you would save your life, you'll lose it, but if you lose your life for my sake, you'll save it. What would you gain if you were to win the whole world but lose yourself in the process?

1. Jesus asks us: "Who do you say that I am?"

2. What is clouding my vision or understanding for who Jesus is? How can I let Jesus come into focus for us in a fresh way?

3. Will we pick up our cross and follow in Jesus' footsteps? What area or issue of my life might "Come and die, that I may live"?
