Mission:

Accomplishments:

- o Sunday School classes this year were provided Jim Cooke, Richard Doster, Mark Edwards, Dennis Hall, Dorothy Little, John Pitts, Jon Schneider, and Jan Smith. Subjects included Old and New Testament studies and themed lessons on prayer, the principles learned from creation, sojourners and exiles, creation science, the Sermon on the Mount, beauty, and eschatology.

- o In the summer, Sally Ericksen returned to provide lessons on the key figures of the Reformation.
