DAY ONE REPENTANCE & PERSONAL HOLINESS

We begin our week of fasting and prayer by humbling ourselves, examining our hearts, and surrendering to the Lord's loving correction. As we pursue Him with a pure heart, we can be sure He hears our prayer. (Ps. 24)

SCRIPTURE TO READ

Psalm 139

For the director of music. Of David. A psalm.

1 You have searched me, Lord,

and you know me.

2 You know when I sit and when I rise;

you perceive my thoughts from afar.

3 You discern my going out and my lying down;

you are familiar with all my ways.

4 Before a word is on my tongue

you, Lord, know it completely.

5 You hem me in behind and before,

and you lay your hand upon me.

6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me,

too lofty for me to attain.

7 Where can I go from your Spirit?

Where can I flee from your presence?

8 If I go up to the heavens, you are there;
if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.

9 If I rise on the wings of the dawn,

if I settle on the far side of the sea,

10 even there your hand will guide me,
your right hand will hold me fast.

11 If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me

DAY ONE

QUESTIONS TO PONDER

- Is there any sin hiding in my heart that I need to confess? (Ps. 66:16-20)
- Are the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart acceptable to you, Lord? (Ps. 19:14)
- Do I have any impure motives or have pride in my heart? (Pr. 16)
- Am I honest and selfless in my dealings with others? (Ps. 15)
- Do my thoughts demonstrate my trust in God? (Ps. 62:7-8; Ro. 12:2)
- With my current level of understanding, am I honestly pursuing holiness with my life? (1 Th. 4:1-12; 1 Pt. 1:13-25; 2 Pt. 1:5-8)
- Am I seeking deeper knowledge of God? (Pr. 2; Je. 29:13)

On this second day of fasting, let's seek to align our hearts with the will of God. In seeking God's will, our goal is to become indifferent to any other direction or vision than the one God chooses. We can trust that His way and timing are perfect and He will accomplish His will in our lives.

DAY TWO GOD'S WILL & GUIDANCE

SCRIPTURE TO READ

¹The Lord had said to Abram, “Go from your country, your people and your father’s household to the land I will show you.
²“I will make you into a great nation,
and I will bless you;
I will make your name great,
and you will be a blessing.
³I will bless those who bless you,
and whoever curses you I will curse;
and all peoples on earth
will be blessed through you.”
⁴So Abram went, as the Lord had told him...
Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran. (Gn. 12:1-4)

¹Now the Lord was gracious to Sarah as he had said, and the Lord did for Sarah what he had promised. ²Sarah became pregnant and bore a son to Abraham in his old age, at the very time God had promised him. ³Abraham gave the name Isaac^[a] to the son Sarah bore him. ⁴When his son Isaac was eight days old, Abraham circumcised him, as God commanded him. ⁵Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him. (Gn. 21:1-5)

7 Now Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, calling it the “tent of meeting.” Anyone inquiring of the Lord would go to the tent of meeting outside the camp. 8 And whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people rose and stood at the entrances to their tents, watching Moses until he entered the tent. 9 As Moses went into the tent, the pillar of cloud would come down and stay at the entrance, while the Lord spoke with Moses. 10 Whenever the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance to the tent, they all stood and worshiped, each at the entrance to their tent. 11 The Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Then Moses would return to the camp, but his young aide Joshua son of Nun did not leave the tent. Exodus 33:7-11

19 “Because of your great compassion you did not abandon them in the wilderness. By day the pillar of cloud did not fail to guide them on their path, nor the pillar of fire by night to shine on the way they were to take. 20 You gave your good Spirit to instruct them. You did not withhold your manna from their mouths, and you gave them water for their thirst. 21 For forty years you sustained them in the wilderness; they lacked nothing, their clothes did not wear out nor did their feet become swollen.

- Are my heart's desires in alignment with God's? (Is. 55; Ps. 37:3-6, 2 Pt. 1:3-10)
- Do I have a decision to make? (Pr. 19:21)
- Is there something the Lord is asking me to do? (Jon. 1:1-3; Mt. 4:18-20)
- Is there a new direction He is asking me to go? (Ps. 32:8-9, Ps. 143:10)
- Am I trusting in His power, wisdom and timing? (Pr. 3:5-6; Ps. 27:13-14)

DAY TWO

INSIGHTS, CONVICTIONS & PRAYER

“The prayer of indifference expresses the fact that we have come to a place where we want God’s will—nothing more, nothing less, nothing else. It means we want God’s will more than our own personal comfort or safety, more than ego-gratification or wanting to look good in the eyes of others, more than our own pleasure or preference, more than whatever it is we think we want. It is a state of wide openness to God in which we are free from undue attachments and have the capacity to relinquish whatever might keep us from choosing for God and for love in the world. It is a prayer in which we abandon ourselves to God.” -Ruth Haley Barton



In the midst of our trials and suffering, we can be sure that God is with us, for us and will lift us up when we are too weak to stand. He is our shield and our strength, our rock and our fortress, our stronghold and deliverer (Ps. 3, 18; Is. 41:10) On our third day of fasting, we will lift up prayers for deliverance and protection.

DAY THREE DELIVERANCE & PROTECTION

SCRIPTURE TO READ

Psalm 107

- 1 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.
- 2 Let the redeemed of the Lord tell their story—those he redeemed from the hand of the foe,
- 3 those he gathered from the lands, from east and west, from north and south.
- 4 Some wandered in desert wastelands, finding no way to a city where they could settle.
- 5 They were hungry and thirsty, and their lives ebbed away.
- 6 Then they cried out to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress.
- 7 He led them by a straight way to a city where they could settle.
- 8 Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind,
- 9 for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things.
- 10 Some sat in darkness, in utter darkness, prisoners suffering in iron chains,

¹¹because they rebelled against God's commands and despised the plans of the Most High.

¹²So he subjected them to bitter labor; they stumbled, and there was no one to help.

¹³Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress.

¹⁴He brought them out of darkness, the utter darkness, and broke away their chains.

¹⁵Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind,

¹⁶for he breaks down gates of bronze and cuts through bars of iron.

¹⁷Some became fools through their rebellious ways and suffered affliction because of their iniquities.

¹⁸They loathed all food and drew near the gates of death.

¹⁹Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress.

²⁰He sent out his word and healed them; he rescued them from the grave.

²¹Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind.

²²Let them sacrifice thank offerings and tell of his works with songs of joy.

²³Some went out on the sea in ships; they were merchants on the mighty waters.

²⁴They saw the works of the Lord, his wonderful deeds in the deep.

²⁵For he spoke and stirred up a tempest that lifted high the waves.

²⁶They mounted up to the heavens and went down to the depths; in their peril their courage melted away.

²⁷They reeled and staggered like drunkards; they were at their wits' end.

²⁸Then they cried out to the Lord in their trouble, and he brought them out of their distress.

²⁹He stilled the storm to a whisper; the waves of the sea^[b] were hushed.

³⁰They were glad when it grew calm, and he guided them to their desired haven.

³¹Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind.

³²Let them exalt him in the assembly of the people and praise him in the council of the elders.

³³He turned rivers into a desert, flowing springs into thirsty ground,

³⁴and fruitful land into a salt waste, because of the wickedness of those who lived there.

³⁵He turned the desert into pools of water and the parched ground into flowing springs;

³⁶there he brought the hungry to live, and they founded a city where they could settle

³⁷They sowed fields and planted vineyards that yielded a fruitful harvest;

³⁸he blessed them, and their numbers greatly increased, and he did not let their herds diminish.

³⁹Then their numbers decreased, and they were humbled by oppression, calamity and sorrow;

⁴⁰he who pours contempt on nobles made them wander in a trackless waste.

⁴¹But he lifted the needy out of their affliction and increased their families like flocks.

⁴²The upright see and rejoice, but all the wicked shut their mouths.

⁴³Let the one who is wise heed these things and ponder the loving deeds of the Lord.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER

- What storms of life am I experiencing-- challenges, trials, hardships? (Jn. 16:33)
- Is there a greater design for my life that God may want to show me? (Ro. 8)
- Am I focusing on the presence and faithfulness of Jesus through my storm? (Mt. 14:22-33)
- What anchor am I holding onto? (He. 6)
- Do I need to express a deeper trust in God? (He. 12)
- Am I able to remain in an abiding faith through my storm? (Jn. 15)
- Are there thoughts I need to take captive and surrender to Jesus? (2 Co. 3-5)
- Do I need to ask for the power of Christ to act against darkness to bring freedom? (Ep. 6:10-20)
- Do I need to seek safety in the Lord? (Ps. 23, 46)
- Do I need to ask for help from my spiritual community?

FIGHTING TOGETHER

We may be tempted to believe we should be able to fight our battles privately through our own strength and prayer. But our spiritual journey is not a solo one.

You don't have to be strong enough to win on your own. True spiritual victory often comes through teamwork, not individual effort. In Exodus 17, the battle between the Israelites and Amalekites turned only when Moses allowed others to support his tired hands. We are called to that same reliance on our spiritual family. Instead of fighting privately, reach out to your community.

Who will you invite to hold up your hands in prayer?

DAY THREE

INSIGHTS, CONVICTIONS & PRAYER



On this fourth day of fasting, let's intercede for others--our community of faith including family, friends and neighbors, and those who will choose to follow Jesus through our prayers and acts of love. Next, we'll pray for those in leadership around the world. Then, we'll finish by praying for those around the world suffering injustice.

DAY FOUR INTERCESSION

SCRIPTURE TO READ

Jesus Prays for His Disciples

6 “I have revealed you to those whom you gave me out of the world. They were yours; you gave them to me and they have obeyed your word. 7 Now they know that everything you have given me comes from you. 8 For I gave them the words you gave me and they accepted them. They knew with certainty that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me. 9 I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours.

10 All I have is yours, and all you have is mine. And glory has come to me through them. 11 I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me. None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled.

¹³ “I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them. ¹⁴ I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. ¹⁵ My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified.

Jesus Prays for All Believers

²⁰ “My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, ²¹ that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²² I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— ²³ I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.

²⁴ “Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world.

²⁵ “Righteous Father, though the world does not know you, I know you, and they know that you have sent me. ²⁶ I have made you known to them, and will continue to make you known in order that the love you have for me may be in them and that I myself may be in them.” (Jn. 15:6-26)

QUESTIONS TO PONDER

- Who in my circle of life is in need of guidance, healing, peace or joy? (Pp. 4:6-7; Jm. 1:5 & 5:14-16)
- Where is God revealing a need for humility and unity in the body of believers? (Ro. 15:5-6)
- Where am I discerning a need for protection from evil? (2 Th. 3:2-3)
- In what ways am I and my community of faith in need of transformation? (1 Th. 5:23-24)
- Who do I know who needs to follow Jesus? (Lk 19:10; 1 Ti. 2:1-4)
- What needs to happen in me in order that He may make himself known through me? (Pp. 1:9-11)

SCRIPTURE TO READ

Psalm 72--Of Solomon.

¹ Endow the king with your justice, O God, the royal son with your righteousness.

² May he judge your people in righteousness, your afflicted ones with justice.

³ May the mountains bring prosperity to the people, the hills the fruit of righteousness.

⁴ May he defend the afflicted among the people and save the children of the needy; may he crush the oppressor.

⁵ May he endure as long as the sun, as long as the moon, through all generations.

⁶ May he be like rain falling on a mown field, like showers watering the earth.

⁷ In his days may the righteous flourish and prosperity abound till the moon is no more.

DAY FOUR

8 May he rule from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth.
9 May the desert tribes bow before him and his enemies lick the dust.
10 May the kings of Tarshish and of distant shores bring tribute to him.
May the kings of Sheba and Seba present him gifts.
11 May all kings bow down to him and all nations serve him.

12 For he will deliver the needy who cry out,
the afflicted who have no one to help.
13 He will take pity on the weak and the
needy and save the needy from death.
14 He will rescue them from oppression and
violence, for precious is their blood in his
sight.

15 Long may he live! May gold from Sheba be given him. May people ever pray for him and bless him all day long.

16 May grain abound throughout the land; on the tops of the hills may it sway. May the crops flourish like Lebanon and thrive like the grass of the field.

17 May his name endure forever; may it continue as long as the sun.
Then all nations will be blessed through him, and they will call him blessed.

¹⁸ Praise be to the Lord God, the God of Israel, who alone does marvelous deeds.
¹⁹ Praise be to his glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory.

- Who are the leaders and decision makers who need prayer for divine wisdom and insight? (Pr. 21:1; Pr. 28:2-3, 10, 16; Jer. 29:7; 1 Ti. 2:1-4)
- How do I need to honor my local and national leaders? (Da. 2:20-22; Ro. 13:1-7)
- How am I sensing God leading me to pray for leaders: submission to God (Dt. 17:18-20), protection from harm and corruption in their hearts (Ps. 91), humble leadership? (Pp. 2:3).
