REVELATION

TEACHER PROMPT | Share an age-appropriate life experience where God protected you using the help of person. Discuss how Father God protects us supernaturally but often God also uses people to carry out His protection.

Protection can be simply defined as to keep safe. Nehemiah 4:9 says, and we pray to our God and set a guard as a protection against them day and night.

Our revelation today is God Is My Protector

Let's pray, Holy Spirit, we welcome you here, we don't make room for you, but we give you the entire room. We ask you to teach us your ways so that we may know you and find your favor. Speak Lord, your servants are listening. Amen.

BIBLE LESSON

TEACHER PROMPT | If you memorize this story and this lesson, it will help you teach it in excellence and allow Holy Spirit to speak to you and through you.

BIBLE LESSON INTRO | Our Bible lesson today is found in Ruth 3+4

Ruth was a hardworking, loyal woman that served and obeyed her mother-in-law even after her own husband died. Ruth's servanthood, loyalty, and obedience to her mother-in-law made her stand out. As a result of her servanthood and obedience Ruth experienced favor. Naomi loved her young daughter-in-law and wanted to find her a new husband. Naomi knew that Ruth could have easily returned to her family, but Ruth chose to stay with her. Our story picks up as Naomi begins finding Ruth a new husband in chapter 3.

One day Ruth's mother-in-law Naomi spoke to her. She said, "My daughter, I must find a home for you. It should be a place where you will be provided for. You have been working with the women who work for Boaz. Tonight, he'll be working. Wash yourself. Put on some perfume. And put on your best clothes. Then go down to where he is, but don't let Boaz know you are there. Wait until he has finished eating and drinking. Pay attention where he lies down. Then go over and uncover



his feet. Lie down there. He'll tell you what to do." So, Ruth did that exactly! When Boaz realized someone was at his feet he said, "Who are you?" "I'm Ruth," she said. "You are my family protector. So, take good care of me by making me your wife." He went on to tell her that he would do whatever she asked but there was another family protector in the family who she should marry.

Boaz went to the other family protector, and he agreed to let Boaz marry Ruth. So they were married and had a son who was the great great great great great great great great grandfather of... Can you guess? King David! All because of Ruth's great honor and obedience to Namoi and God.

Do you know who else was born from the line of Boaz? (give time to guess) Jesus!

TEACHER PROMPT | Have children make a giant line and read Matthew 1 below starting at Boaz, as you read through go down the line of children and touch their head indicating that they are that person, once you go past them the sit down.

David was the father of Solomon. Solomon was the father of Rehoboam. Rehoboam was the father of Abijah. Abijah was the father of Asa. Asa was the father of Jehoshaphat. Jehoshaphat was the father of Jehoram. Jehoram was the father of Uzziah. Uzziah was the father of Jotham. Jotham was the father of Ahaz. Ahaz was the father of Hezekiah. Hezekiah was the father of Manasseh. Manasseh was the father of Amon. Amon was the father of Josiah. And Josiah was the father of Jeconiah and his brothers. At that time, the Jewish people were forced to go away to Babylon. After this, the family line continued. Jeconiah was the father of Shealtiel. Shealtiel was the father of Zerubbabel. Zerubbabel was the father of Abihud. Abihud was the father of Eliakim. Eliakim was the father of Azor. Azor was the father of Zadok. Zadok was the father of Akim. Akim was the father of Elihud. Elihud was the father of Eleazar. Eleazar was the father of Matthan. Matthan was the father of Jacob. Jacob was the father of Joseph. Joseph was the husband of Mary. And Mary was the mother of Jesus, who is called the Messiah.

If it were not for Ruth and Boaz, Jesus our Messiah would not have been born! God has such a great plan in everything and for everything.

TEACHER PROMPT | Ask Holy Spirit what He wants to do in this next moment. This can look like asking children to remember times when God has been their protector or ask Him to come be protector over areas in their life.

SALVATION + DISCUSSION

TEACHER PROMPT | This invitation to an eternity with Jesus is huge! Be sensitive to what Holy Spirit wants to do in this time. Ask Him to think through your thoughts and speak through your mouth!

SAY | God loves YOU so much that He gave his only Son that anyone who believes, in Jesus, might be saved and have everlasting life, John 3:16. God wants to be close to you. He has taken every step to be close to you. If you have never accepted Jesus into your heart, you can today! (You can invite children to raise hands, come forward, etc. have everyone repeat prayer together)

PRAYER | Father God you are Holy. Holy Spirit, we thank you for all that you teach us and that we get to know you Jesus, we thank you for laying down your life so that we can be close to you. Jesus, would you forgive us from our sins. Would you come live in our heart forever. Amen.
