LESSON OVERVIEW

Revelation: Adonai is my God and King

Bible Lesson: Genesis 15

Heart: When you trust in Father God and allow Him to be Lord and master of your life, you will experience the fullness of promises He has made.

Memory Verse: “Then you will call my name. You will come to me and pray to me, and I will listen to you.” – Jeremiah 29:12

REVELATION

This month we will unpack different names of God and how His names show us who He is.

We have discovered:

- Immanuel, God is with me. Jesus is the son of God and He came down to Earth to make a way for us to be with Father God. He is Immanuel, God with us.
- Jireh, God is my provider. Abraham trusted God to provide for him, God provides everything that we need.

Today we will discover what it means to trust in God, even when it doesn't make sense. He is your God and your King, He rules all of time and holds everything in the palm of His hand.

Our revelation today is Adonai is my God and King

Let's pray, Holy Spirit, we welcome you here, we don't make room for you, but we give you the entire room. We ask you to teach us your ways so that we may know you and find your favor. Speak Lord, your servants are listening. Amen.

BIBLE LESSON

TEACHER PROMPT | If you memorize this story and this lesson, it will help you teach it in excellence and allow Holy Spirit to speak to you and through you.

BIBLE LESSON INTRO | Our Bible lesson today is found in Genesis 15

Before Abraham was called Abraham, his name was Abram. Abram and his wife Sarai (who was later named Sarah), had wanted children but the Lord hadn't given them any yet. Abram and Sarai trusted that God would provide them a son, and guess what? He did!

One day Abram had a vision, in this vision the Lord said to him,



“Abram do not be afraid. I am like a shield to you. I am your very great reward.”

But Abram said back to God, and called Him Adonai, which means my God and King.

As I read the rest of the story listen carefully and when I say Adonai you say: My God and King! (practice a few times)

So, Abram responded with “Adonai (my God and King), what can you give me? I still don’t have any children. My servant Eliezer comes from Damascus. When I die, he will get everything I own.” Abram continued, Adonai (my God and King), “You haven’t given me any children. So, this servant of mine will get everything I own.” Then a message from the Lord came to Abram. The Lord said, “When you die, what you have will not go to this man. You will have a son of your own. He will get everything you have.” The Lord took Abram outside and said, “Look up at the sky. Count the stars, if you can.” Then he said to him, “That’s how many children will be born into your family.” Abram believed the Lord. The Lord was pleased with Abram because he believed. So, Abram’s faith made him right with the Lord.

Abram trusted Adonai (my God and King) and allowed Him to be LORD and master of his life. Later God delivered His promise to Abram by giving him a son named Isaac. Isaac had Jacob, who was the father of the 12 tribes of Israel. God has given Abraham as many children as there are stars in the sky.

When you trust Adonai (my God and King), as YOUR God and YOUR King, you can walk in peace knowing every promise He has made to you, He will fulfill!

Our revelation today is Adonai is my God and King

TEACHER PROMPT | Ask Holy Spirit what He wants to do in this next moment. This can look like a moment of asking children what they are believing God for or asking Father God what His promises are over them.

SALVATION + DISCUSSION

TEACHER PROMPT | This invitation to an eternity with Jesus is huge! Be sensitive to what Holy Spirit wants to do in this time. Ask Him to think through your



thoughts and speak through your mouth!

SAY | God loves YOU so much that He gave his only Son that anyone who believes, in Jesus, might be saved and have everlasting life, John 3:16. God wants to be close to you. He has taken every step to be close to you. If you have never accepted Jesus into your heart, you can today! (You can invite children to raise hands, come forward, etc. have everyone repeat prayer together)

PRAYER | Father God you are Holy. Holy Spirit, we thank you for all that you teach us and that we get to know you Jesus, we thank you for laying down your life so that we can be close to you. Jesus, would you forgive us from our sins. Would you come live in our heart forever. Amen.

CELEBRATION | At TLC one of our values is Celebration. If you made this amazing decision to give your life to Jesus today, please stand up so we can CELEBRATE YOU! Let's Celebrate our friends who gave their life to Jesus today! WOOHOO!!
