CAMBODIA

I was able to travel with Multiplication Network (John Wagenveld and Ken Neevel) to Cambodia to see the work they are doing there to plant churches with indigenous people. Cambodia is made up of 95-98% Buddhist and Hindu. In the 70's, they experienced years of what is known as the "Killing Fields," where many of the educated were killed. During that time, a few thousand Christians were meeting in underground churches. Many did not survive the Genocide.

Thankfully the church has seen a resurgence in recent years. While I was in Cambodia, we were able to meet with a few survivors from the "Killing Fields." Paulet is one such survivor working alongside Multiplication Network to begin training and raising leaders in church plants across the country.

First Reformed Church is exploring how Multiplication Network fits our vision of going to the "ends of the earth" to unreached people groups across the globe.











HAITI
