A message from Ben Cole, Senior Minister

With all the evil that was witnessed in our nation and around the world in September, God laid this verse on

my heart:

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." (Galatians 6:9)

We recently saw a shocking act of violence you think would have left the world grieving. Sadly, it did not. What made it even more troubling was how quickly some rushed to celebrate what was clearly evil as if it were good. Obviously, our world is confused on exactly what is good and what is evil.

Scripture reminds us that it is not enough to rely on the world's definition of good. Jesus Himself said, "No one is good but God alone." (Mark 10:18) This means true goodness does not come from my opinion. It does not come from your opinion. True goodness comes from God and God alone.

Now that we have settled what is good, let us touch on evil. What does God call evil? Pretty easy, He calls it sin. 

It's time to look into your medicine cabinet and pull out those expired prescriptions and those you don't use anymore. Getting



Candy donations can be dropped off at the Warehouse.






Breast Cancer Awareness

Other than skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer among American women. For many women, mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat. Mammograms can find cancer before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms.



- Each year in the United States, about 270,000 women get breast cancer and 42,000 women die from the disease.
- Men also get breast cancer, but it is not very common. About 1 out of every 100 breast cancers diagnosed in the United States is found in a man.
- Most breast cancers are found in women who are 50 years old or older, but breast cancer also affects younger women.

From 2018 to 2022, about 2 in 3 female breast cancer cases were diagnosed at a localized stage, meaning the cancer had not spread outside the breast. About 1 in 4 female breast cancers were found at a regional stage (the cancer had spread to nearby lymph nodes, tissues, or organs), and 6% were found at a distant stage (the cancer had spread to distant parts of the body).

Overall, 92% of female breast cancer patients had not died from their cancer 5 years later. However, survival rates differed depending on the stage at which the cancer was detected. Survival is higher when breast cancer is found before it has spread to other parts of the body. Screening can find breast cancers earlier. Mammograms are the best way for females of average risk to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before the tumor is big enough to feel or cause symptoms. Call your Doctor today and get you mammogram scheduled. (cdc.gov)
