

A NEW ADVENT BEYOND THE HORIZON

Beloved Friends in Christ,

As we stand on the edge of another Advent season, I invite you to lift your eyes toward the horizon. There, just beyond the shadows of our present moment, a new dawn is stirring. The sky, though still heavy with night, carries the faint blush of morning. It is the promise of light breaking through our darkness, the whisper of hope that refuses to be silenced.

Advent is not merely a countdown to Christmas—it is a holy waiting, a posture of expectation. We wait not for a vague dream or distant ideal, but for the One who has already come and who promises to come again. We wait for Emmanuel, God with us, who stepped into the world's midnight and lit it with the brilliance of divine love.

The incarnation is the miracle at the heart of our faith: the eternal Word made flesh, dwelling among us. In Jesus Christ, heaven bent low to touch earth, and the Creator walked among His creation. This is no abstract theology—it is the living truth that God has chosen to be with us in every valley, every shadow, every uncertainty.

The light we await is not fragile, but fierce enough to pierce the deepest night. This is no flickering candle that trembles in the wind, but the radiant glory of Christ who shines into every shadow. His light exposes what is broken, heals what is wounded, and guides our steps when the path feels uncertain. Advent is the season when we dare to believe that even the darkest corners of our lives cannot resist the brilliance of God's love.

The manger and the cross, the cradle and the tomb, remind us that God's love is both tender and triumphant. In the manger, we see humility—God choosing to dwell among us in vulnerability. On the cross, we see sacrifice—love poured out to redeem the world. And in the empty tomb, we see victory—death defeated and hope restored. Advent gathers all these truths together, pointing us toward the Christ who comes to dwell with us, suffer for us, and reign over us.

So we wait—not passively, but with hearts awake and hands ready. We wait as those who know the story does not end in darkness. We wait as those who believe that the Christ who came as a child will come again as King.

May this Advent be for us a season of holy anticipation, where we lean forward into the horizon, trusting that the dawn is near. And when the light breaks, may we be found ready to welcome Him—Emmanuel, God with us.



JOEL EVERETTE, TO BE THE ACCOMPANIST AND SEVERAL VISITING CHOIR MEMBERS.



MISSION OVERVIEW

We continue to provide weekend food support for students at Coddle Creek Elementary who may otherwise go without. As of November 12, we are serving 23 children through this ministry. In addition, we provided each of their families (17 total) with Thanksgiving meal fixings along with a Food Lion gift card to help cover the cost of turkey and other groceries.

We also supported 10 families connected with Hope of Mooresville by providing Food Lion gift cards to assist them in obtaining meat during the period when SNAP benefits were unavailable.

Financial donations were made to Feed NC, the Christian Mission, and the Children's Home during this time as well. Not only did we contribute what was allocated in our outreach budget, but we also provided additional support through the Knox Fund and outreach funds from the sale of the Triplett property.

We collected 72 shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child, many of which were lovingly prepared by our youth. We are currently gathering gifts through the Prison Ministry Angel Tree Program and will distribute these shortly before Christmas.

In December, we will be collecting winter coats for the residents of the Children's Homes of Iredell County in Statesville. Additionally, we are partnering with them to host an informational meeting on fostering children, which will be held at Fair View on December 6th. We are reaching out to other area churches to make this a community-wide event.

As winter break approaches, we will also be sending additional backpack food bags and a Food Lion gift card home with students at Coddle Creek to help support them during the extended time away from school.
