



REALIGNING

Read Luke 6:17-38

There is something about just hitting the open road and the rhythmic sound of the road that can be peaceful when your head is filled with the chaotic rhythm of life. I have taken drives in the mountains and even a trip out west. With each trip or drive, the roads are different depending on where you drive. You can be on a new and smooth patch of road, where the tires almost hum, then there are the concrete highways that have the rhythmic sound each time the tires hit a new section giving the sound of thud-thump over and over. There's the sound of gravel roads and the rumble and cracking underneath the weight of the car.

As I drive, my racing mind slows down to be present in the here and now. It can be relaxing and soothing to my thoughts which often times are pulled this way and that. It helps me sometimes to realign and remember the Truth in Scripture which is written in Psalm 119, verse 105, "Thy Word will be a lamp unto my feet and light unto my path."

Every mile, twist and turn, I find my way with God.

That is, of course, if your car is aligned. Have you ever driven or road in a car that is misaligned? There are often loud sounds which drown out the normal rhythm of the road. Not only will the sounds distract and hinder our ability to hear the path under our tires, but if you are unlucky enough to be extremely out of alignment, your car can even vibrate in your hands.

I had a small Miata when I was a younger man. The car was awesome to take on short drives. A little convertible, I loved riding with the top down enjoying the scenery. However, I got it because it had been in an accident, making it more affordable. Now the previous owner had fixed it up but there was no way to get it completely back into alignment. The car would be okay until you hit 45 mph, when at that point, you had to crank up the radio and hold on. The vibration and sound was something else.

Those that came to Jesus in our passage this month were troubled with unclean spirits, in need of healing. Their world was vibrating out of control. They were cut off from life and community. They were seeking realignment with God and a quick fix for their lives. It's then that Jesus sat his disciples down and gave them one of the most influential sermons He ever gave in His ministry. The Beatitudes are a sound check of their lives and ours.

What sound does your life make on the path you are taking right now?

Is the simple rhythm of life being drowned out?

Are you in need of realignment? It's not always an easy fix.

The Good news is God not only shows us how we are out of alignment with the kingdom, but He became the very power to realign our relationship with God. He showed us by his example what it looks like to be Poor in Spirit, Hungry for a relationship with God, Weeping for what breaks God's heart, and Blessed even while being hated by the world. This realignment took Him to the Cross, through the grave and back to life again. As I said it wasn't an easy fix. But, God is calling us to a realigning journey with Jesus.

I challenge you to listen beyond the noise to hear the new rhyme He is calling us to walk. Perhaps if we take notes from his sermon, we can see His light He has been shining at our feet.

Care Kits are available from the bin under the rear portico and in the Narthex. Please carry a few in your vehicle when you cross paths with someone in need.

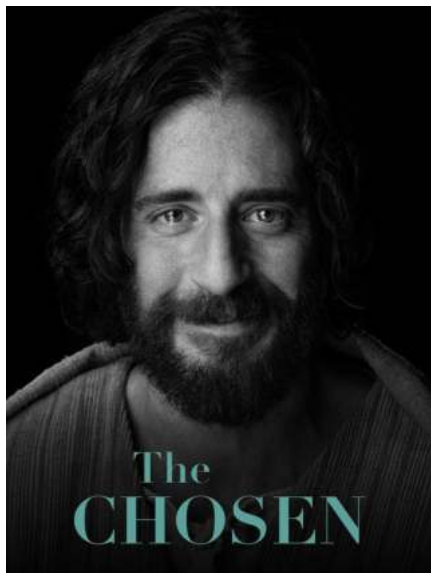

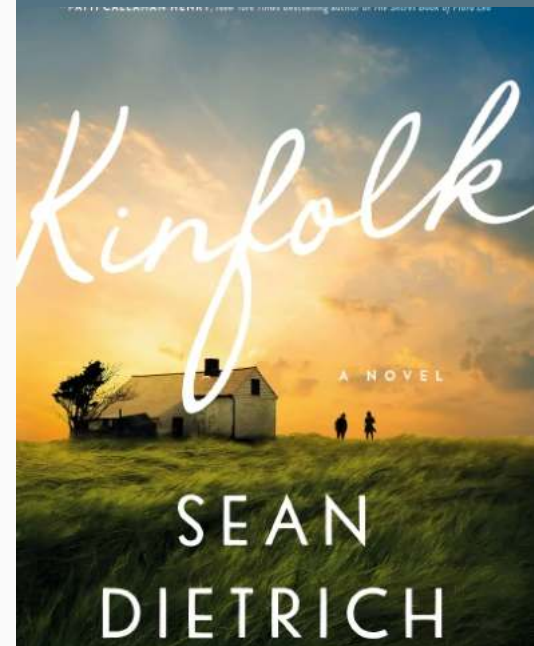

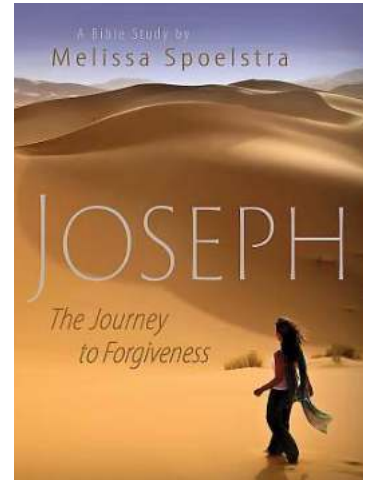

Members and friends of Fair View are eligible to purchase discounted tickets for \$25/ticket directly from Krystal up until Thursday March 14th.

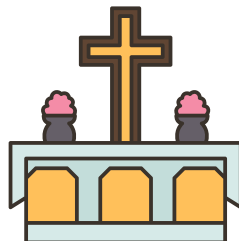

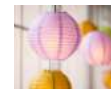

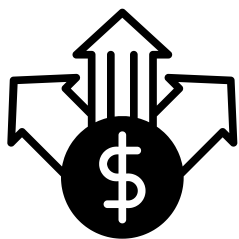

SCOUTING AROUND WITH CUB SCOUT PACK #173

On Monday, January 15th the Scouts attended a Vesper Service at the Rocky Mount Church involving Packs and Troops from all of Iredell County.

On January 27th Cub Scout Pack # 173 held its annual Cub Scout Pinewood Derby Race at the Coddle Creek Elementary School. Scouts raced in the event that was exciting for all involved. The top three winners will advance to the Gemstone District (Iredell County) race in April. For the adults, there was also held an "Almost Anything Goes Race" as well as a race for siblings of the Scouts.



February is the birthday month for the Boy Scouts of America. The Boys Scouts of America was formed in 1910. The Cub Scout program was not formed however until 1930 so the month of February will be their 94th anniversary at the national level. Cub Scout Pack #173 that is sponsored by Fair View was formed 54 years ago on January 23, 1970.
