## LIVING WITH PURPOSE: A WITNESS IN EVERY SEASON

*Reflections from Titus Chapter 2 for the New Year*

As we step into a new year, many of us feel the pull of fresh beginnings—new goals, new rhythms, new opportunities. Titus chapter 2 reminds us that the call to live with purpose and bear witness to the kingdom of God is not bound by age, circumstance, or calendar. Instead, it is a lifelong invitation to let God's grace shape us in every season.

### Purpose Beyond Age or Stage

Paul's words in Titus 2 highlight that each generation has a role in God's mission:

- **Older men** are called to be steady and sound in faith.
- **Older women** are invited to mentor and encourage.
- **Younger believers** are urged to live with self-control and integrity.
- Even daily work and service become opportunities to glorify God.

This new year is a reminder that no matter where you find yourself—young or old, beginning or seasoned—you carry a divine purpose. Every stage of life is a chance to live out the gospel.

### Witness in Ordinary Life

The turning of the calendar often inspires us to dream big, but Paul reminds us that witness begins in the ordinary. The way we speak, love, work, and serve becomes a testimony to God's kingdom. As Titus 2:10 says, our lives can "make the teaching about God our Savior attractive." What better resolution could we embrace than to let our daily faithfulness point others to Christ?





## Movers & Shakers







But when the lovely, mysterious widow Grace March moves into the attic room, she draws her oddball collection of neighbors into unlikely friendship: poised English beauty Fliss, whose facade of perfect wife and mother covers gaping inner wounds; policeman's daughter Nora, who finds herself entangled with a shadowy gangster; frustrated baseball star Beatrice, whose career has come to an end along with the women's baseball league of WWII; and poisonous, gung-ho Arlene, who has thrown herself into McCarthy's Red Scare.

Grace's weekly attic-room dinner parties and window-brewed sun tea become a healing balm on all their lives, but she hides a terrible secret of her own. When a shocking act of violence tears the house apart, the Briar Club women must decide once and for all: who is the true enemy in their midst?

Capturing the paranoia of the McCarthy era and evoking the changing roles for women in postwar America, *The Briar Club* is an intimate and thrilling novel of secrets and loyalty put to the test.


## M.O.M.S BIBLE STUDY

The M.O.M.S Bible Study will resume with their monthly meetings starting January 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m.


We will meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of every month except for June, July, & August.

In December we continued to provide food for 21 children at Coddle Creek, care of the Back Pack Ministry. We also sent home extra food to help over Christmas Break, as well as a Food Lion gift card for each of the families, to help ease the burden. We collected 18 winter coats as Christmas gifts for the older children that are in resident homes with the Children's Homes of Iredell County. Along with that we are participating in the Prison Fellowship Angel Tree program, where children receive a gift with a message from a parent who is currently incarcerated. In January we will be collecting need items and monetary donations for HOMe (Hope of Mooresville), which helps provides temporary assistance to homeless women and children to get them back on their feet.




## PRISON FELLOWSHIP ANGEL TREE FOLLOW UP


