

NEW TERRITORY

Please read Exodus 13:17-22

As we walk the road toward Easter, we are reminded how we too often walk a wilderness road. One that leads us, to places we may never walk on our own. In this passage, we read how the Israelites could have taken the short route back to the promise land. Problem was that journey would have taken them through territory they were not yet prepared for. God knew that for them to journeying through that land would end up derailing the plan He ultimately had for his people.

They first must to learn to trust God.

God had already shown himself faithful in the delivering them from Egypt. God showed it through the plagues in Egypt and ultimately through the Passover; the final plague that cause Pharaoh to release them. He had provided in the verse preceding this one with means and funds to travel from the very people that enslaved them. Even here in this passage, we hear of God fulfilling a promise to Joseph to be taken home. God is faithful. God, however, needed to prepare His people for a life beyond slavery and bondage to a life of radical faith and obedience.

The Israelites were used to working the fields, quarries and land of Egypt as slaves. They knew how to follow the voice of Pharaoh but it had been some time since they had truly followed the God of Abraham, God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. They would have also known that God was leading them "Wrong Way" out of town. They probably had questions. Why are you leading us out there? Don't you see the Red Sea ahead? Can't you hear the rumbling of the chariots of Pharaoh behind us?

Later in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus was also leading His disciples and telling them of the cross He would die on, and Peter, like the Israelites here, took him aside and began to rebuke him(Mark 8:32). Peter, like the Israelites, struggle with the being lead to uncomfortable and painful places. I think if we are honest with ourselves, we too like to escape those liminal spaces as well. It's why the season of Lent is often glossed over in the Easter journey.

I would like to offer this Lenten season as a time to reflect upon the lessons you may still need to learn. For the Israelites, it was a new perspective beyond slavery. For Peter, it was learning the difference from his will and God's will. What Territory is God taking you through to prepare you for this year's Good Friday? How will your faith and trust in God need to be strengthen before we ever welcome Jesus in triumphant entry in our lives? What uncomfortable and real wilderness will you have to wrestle with before the empty tomb can be opened anew?

This month's passage come to close with the Israelites following God in a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. Whatever journey of exploration you may still need to go through to prepare for Resurrection Sunday, remember to look up. God is never far from you in this journey. He is always right in front of you leading you to the next step.






M.O.M. - The Mission of Moms Bible Study Continues

All of us know what it's like to be hurt or betrayed. Often it's a small breach such as being spoken to rudely or overlooked in a time of need. Other times we experience lies, gossip, or harsh words that cut us to the core. Some of us have endured unspeakable pain through abuse, adultery, or abandonment. God knows the pain we cause each other and longs to help us learn to practice forgiveness. Nowhere do we see forgiveness played out more fully in Scripture than in the biblical story of Joseph.

This six-week study explores what God has to say to us about grace and forgiveness through Joseph's story of trial and triumph found in Genesis 37–50. As we study his dreams, his betrayers, his dysfunctional family, his struggle to forgive, and his journey toward reconciliation, we'll find truths that echo into our own personal situations.



We meet on Monday, March 11, in Wesley at 6:45, following the Faith Study.....which you are welcome to join us for as well!




