

### FAITHFUL IN EXILE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As I have been reflecting on the book of Daniel, I am struck by how timely his story feels for us today. Daniel and his friends were carried into exile, far from home, surrounded by a culture that sought to rename them, retrain them, and reshape them into its own image. Exile was not only about geography—it was about identity. Would they forget who they were as God's people, or would they remain faithful in a foreign land?

In many ways, we too live as "resident exiles." The world around us often pulls us toward values and identities that compete with the Gospel. We are tempted to define ourselves by success, politics, or possessions rather than by the truth that we are beloved sons and daughters of God through Christ. Like Israel in Babylon, we face the question: Will we lose our identity, or will we live faithfully as God's people in this season?

Daniel shows us what faithfulness looks like:

- He resolved not to defile himself, even in small daily choices (Dan. 1:8).
- He spoke with courage and humility, honoring God while respecting those in authority.
- He engaged fully in the life of Babylon, yet never compromised his allegiance to the Lord.
- He trusted in God's sovereignty, even when circumstances looked bleak.
- He bore witness through hope, pointing to the eternal kingdom that would outlast every earthly empire.




### **Book Club**

Through this ministry, we'll help provide toys and gifts for children whose parents are incarcerated—a powerful way to remind these kids that they are loved and not forgotten, especially during the Christmas season.

In addition, our backpack ministry will once again share extra food and a Food Lion gift card with the Coddle Creek children and their families, helping to provide many of the fixings for their Thanksgiving meal. It's a blessing to serve our community and to be part of what God is doing through these acts of kindness and compassion.

### WALK FOR LIFE RECAP By Brenda Harvey

We are ecstatic to report that the 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Walk for Life supporting the Community Pregnancy of Lake Norman surpassed their goal of \$150,000 by raising \$181,107.36. There was a large turnout of walkers on a beautiful October Saturday morning. The director announced that 61 babies lives had been saved since last year's walk and a heart for each life was featured around the site. Fair View walkers ranked 18th out of 40 teams by raising \$2,320. This was our mission outreach for the month of September. Thank you for your continued support for this Christian ministry in our community.



For now, I can tell you that with this program you only purchase one \$20 gift for a child, and we will have a group of volunteers who will personally hand these gifts to the children and witness the impact we are making.
