

RESTING IN THE SHADOW OF THE ALMIGHTY

Psalm 91:1-2 (NLT)

"Those who live in the shelter of the Most High will find rest in the shadow of the Almighty. This I declare about the LORD: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; he is my God, and I trust him."

Often we approach the Bible with a checklist mentality—scanning for usable verses, crossing off our daily reading, moving on. Yet our forebearers in the Faith remind us that Scripture is meant primarily for communion with God, not just for extracting information about Him.

The ancient practice of Lectio Divina—divine reading—invites us to slow down, to linger over a single phrase, to let our hearts breathe the text as we would savor a conversation with a dear friend. In this rhythm of reading, meditating, praying, and contemplating, we open ourselves to the Spirit's gentle promptings and fresh encounters.

Consider these questions as you settle into God's presence and Word:

- Do we study the Bible, or does the Bible study us?
- Do we aim to master its content, or allow it to master our lives?
- How expectant are we when we open these pages?



Bernard of Clairvaux, a 12th-century monk, described the transformative power of meditative prayer on Scripture:

"Meditating on the word strengthens me so that I can face the trials and burdens that are an inevitable part of human experience. To do this I can take a simple phrase from the Bible, like 'The LORD is the stronghold of my life' (Psalm 27:1), and pray it on repeat throughout my day. This has the power to redirect my thinking and to change the way I live."

Let Bernard's words guide you. Ask the Lord today, "Which verse from your word would you have me pray through this day and week?"

As you ponder, hear Bernard's testimony to divine intimacy:

"Consider how great is the grace of intimacy which results from the encounter of the soul and the Word, and how great the confidence which follows this intimacy! I think such a soul need not fear to say, 'My beloved is mine."

Take that phrase into your heart now: "My beloved is mine."

Then imagine the Lord speaking it back to you: "You are my beloved."

Every word of Scripture echoes this truth.

Thank You, Lord, for nourishing us through Your Word. It is sweeter than honey and a gateway to revelation and encounter. Forgive us for racing through it as if it were fast food. Today, we choose to slow down, to steep our hearts in Your truth, and to come with expectant hunger. Speak, Lord. Your servants are listening.


Book Club


FAIR VIEW KIDZ



- -October 5 Ms. Kathy will be going over some finance basics with us.




FAIR VIEW YOUTH
