



# **GLPC KIDS**

GLPC Kids has had a fun-filled year! We kicked off the 2019 school year with a revamped Children's Worship time. Children learned why we worship, The Lord's Prayer, and began learning the books of the Old Testament. GLPC member, Tom Wilson, offered his musical talents for a time of praise and worship with the kids. We also added an additional elementary Sunday School class to ensure each child receives age appropriate lessons.

# MISSIONS

One of the many ministries that GLPC supports is Amazing Place. Amazing Place West is a new ministry for Katy which provides evaluations, counseling, programming, community education, and caregiver support for people experiencing mild to moderate dementia. It offers a safe and engaging place for people with dementia to socialize while offering a few hours' respite to family caregivers.

Day Program. Although Covid-19 has paused the in-person program, four hours of virtual care, five days a week, is available through subscription for caregivers.

Connections Programming continues to provide community education, counseling and evaluations, and family support through the Savvy Caregiving Program. The virtual, free 6-week course connects caregivers with an understanding of dementia, its effects on behavior and how to develop strategies for caregiving and decision making.

The Caregiver Support Program is open to the public and currently meeting virtually the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursdays and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of every month. 



# **FINANCE REPORT**

### **GLPC Finance Year in Review**

As a starting point, let me offer a quick recap of our Operating Budget for 2020. The Session approved an operating budget for the year based on total revenue of \$807,200. 75% of this budget is comprised of Pledge Income, 15% is Non-Pledge income, and 10% is

Facilities Use and other miscellaneous income.

Income Report: Through the first 7 months of the year, the church has brought in \$409,000 in revenue (\$388,000 of this amount is Pledge and Non-Pledge contributions). This represents 91% of the budgeted income for this


category through July – a shortfall in budgeted pledge dollars of about \$37,000. We are also down almost \$8,000 in facilities use fees since our building has been closed to outside group activities.

While we are down slightly in terms of the rate of our giving, let's also point out that, because of COVID, church attendance year-to-date is down about 163% from the same time last year. This means that our members are doing a fantastic job of utilizing the alternate forms of giving that are available via online or mail in options.


Expense Report: Overall, we are managing expenses well. Year-to-date expenses are \$404,000 compared to \$440,000 which we budgeted for the first seven months. We do anticipate needed repairs in the near future (2 out-of-commission air conditioning units,

several projects relating to the kitchen, and some other lingering repairs).

The bottom line: Factoring in what GLPC has paid toward its building debt year-to-date, GLPC has a cash flow shortfall of \$24,000 through the first 7 months of 2020.



We have much to say grace over at Grand Lakes Presbyterian Church, and I feel the commitment and faithfulness of our members is at the top of that list. The church is doing "okay." We have a conservative strategy to managing our cash balances which is why we budget to a break-even level. The goal is to preserve cash, reduce debt, and stay focused on our commitment to "celebrating the grace and glory of God through meaningful worship, study, service, outreach, and caring relationships of our members and community."
