

Worship 101: What's It All About?

As we begin a new church year, it's a good time to pause and reflect on why we worship. Our constitution covers it pretty well. (As a reminder, our PCUSA constitution consists of two volumes: The Book of Confessions and the Book of Order. The Book of Order contains the Directory for Worship.) The following shortened excerpts from the Directory for Worship help remind us why we attend church and worship.

Glory to God

Christian worship gives all glory and honor, praise and thanksgiving, to the holy, triune God. We are sent out in service to glorify the same God who is present and active in the world.

Grace and Gratitude

God acts with grace; we respond with gratitude. God claims us as beloved children; we proclaim God's saving love. God redeems us from sin and death; we rejoice in the gift of new life.

Jesus Christ

"Fully human, fully God," Jesus Christ came into the world to show God's love, to save us from sin, and to offer eternal, abundant life to all. In worship, we study and praise Jesus Christ as the model for our grateful response to God.

The Holy Spirit

"The giver and renewer of life," the Holy Spirit instills our faith and enables us to follow Jesus Christ. The Scriptures describe how the Spirit moved at the dawn of creation, anointed Christ in baptism, raised Jesus from the dead, and was poured out on the Church at Pentecost. Christian worship affirms to us that the Spirit is still at work in our lives, the life of the Church and the life of the world.

Word and Sacrament

In Christian worship we can have a strong sense of Jesus Christ being truly present and active among us, by the power of the Holy Spirit, and through the gifts of Word and Sacrament. Through these means of grace, God imparts and sustains our faith, orders our common life, and transforms the world.

Sharing the Good News

A lively and committed worshiping congregation is a great way to reach other people with the Gospel—a primary responsibility of all Christians.

GLPC FACILITIES

Did you know that our sanctuary was officially opened on June 28, 2007? The GLPC campus is comprised of a 23,000 square foot sanctuary and multipurpose building which sits on over 10.5 acres of beautiful trees and lawn.

Like your house, our building and property requires a systematic maintenance/updating program to maintain a safe and fully functional building and grounds. Last year our 14-member mowing team did an excellent job keeping our property clean and freshly mowed. We estimate that this team saved our church at minimum of \$50,000 per year. Our landscape and facilities teams completely redesigned and updated our flower beds, repaired the many sprinkler systems, upgraded 50% of our parking lot

lights and 100% of our facility exterior lights to low voltage LED light and trimmed nine oak trees around the rear entrance and children's playground.

In 2022, our teams have several major updating/ maintenance projects identified of which we are beginning to solicit competitive bids. As you can expect, at times there are small projects that need attention, so if you have a couple of free hours one afternoon or evening, please let me know.

Additionally, we would like to expand the church's hand tools inventory beyond its current one hammer, one pair of pliers, two screwdrivers, and four paint brushes. If you have tools that need a new home please consider dropping them off at the church.

FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP

2021 Financial Recap: 2021 was another strange year for many of us. Grand Lakes elders approved a conservative budget for last year expecting more uncertainty carrying over from 2020. Our pledge numbers for the year represented about a 27% decrease from before the pandemic began. Unsure about what our in-person worship and other face to face activities would look like, we managed expenses extremely well during the year as we aimed to protect the church's resources and the gifts from all of you.

To our delight, the year progressed in an extremely positive direction. In-person worship increased, face to face activities resumed, and giving held strong. We ended the year more or less hitting our expense budget right on the nose. This included some much needed investment in property maintenance as well as fulfilling all of our commitments to Mission. Where we exceeded expectations was in the pledged and nonpledged giving categories. Our goal is always to budget

to a break even number. We ended the year with a sixfigure surplus and a significant increase to our cash reserves.

Even more encouraging, we had a successful stewardship campaign led by Jim Thompson which represented a 20% increase to our campaign from the year prior. What does this mean? We will share with you more during our upcoming congregational meeting, but for now we are happy to report that we will be reinvesting this surplus from 2021 and the improved stewardship numbers back into the church. We will be looking at other capital improvements to be completed and we will be looking to grow our programs in youth, adult education, and children's ministries. We are also doubling down on our commitment to Mission. This is all possible thanks to God's love and the faith and support of all of you. Thank you and God bless GLPC in 2022.
