



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Chaos:

When have you felt like your life was spinning out of control? What helped you (or didn't help you) in that season?

How do you tend to respond to chaos — by trying to control it, escape it, or surrender it to God?

Thrones:

What does the image of God's throne in Revelation 4 tell us about who God is and how God relates to our chaos?

The sermon mentioned "worldly thrones" that create chaos (career, image, politics, etc.). Which of these tempt you most to put your hope in them rather than in God?

A Calm Sea:

How does viewing your life's chaos from God's "throne room perspective" change the way you interpret what's happening around you?

Share about a time when God brought a calm to the chaos in your life.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS, CONT.

Look Up, Surrender, Worship:

What does it practically look like to “look up” in the midst of chaos?

How can worship shift our perspective when life feels uncertain or painful?

In what ways can surrender actually bring freedom and peace, even when circumstances haven't changed?

Live it Out:

What is one area of your life right now where you need to “lay down your crown” and trust that God is still on the throne?

What practical habits or rhythms help you “look up” when life feels overwhelming?

How can your small group, church family, or community help each other keep eyes fixed on God's throne when chaos hits?

Prayer Focus:

Close by inviting each person to name one area of life where they need to “look up, surrender, and worship.” Pray over those areas together, emphasizing God's reign and peace.
