### INSTRUMENTS FOR GOD'S GLORY

The beginning of the year is always a fun and challenging time around FBC. We are saying goodbye to the year that has passed with all of its victories, trials, triumphs, and treasures, and we are depending all the more on Christ to continue the good work of the gospel and to show up in a precious way that marks our hearts and church for years to come. Many of our church members I have had the privilege of spending time with recently or speaking with, have hinted at a fresh vision for their lives and faith journeys in 2026. It seems that the Lord is graciously giving us a collective holy anticipation for what he could do with yielded lives in the year to come. In the scriptures, we see that God used a burning bush, a staff, a donkey, and even an ark to carry his message, glory, and presence. I wonder this year if our own lives will join the ranks of these consecrated instruments. Yes, instruments indeed. It seems better (and safer analogy) to compare our family to instruments rather than donkeys, so let's meditate here a moment. You and I are instruments. All playing together that we might host the message of the gospel, the glory of the Lord, and the very presence, which is "Christ in you the hope of glory." We are an orchestra of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> chairs. Some have been following Jesus playing in tune and glorifying God, some are fresh on the scene, recently captivated by the gospel, and seem to be prodigies as they live out the gospel while the heart of God resonates from their life-instrument with resounding boldness and clarity. Regardless of where you find yourself, it's unmistakable that God has called all of his people to come together so that he might be lifted and so that we might be in community. Considering these things, I know a few things for certain.

First, every instrument needs to be tuned. We all desperately need the Spirit to search us and refine our rough edges, to lay waste to our sin and its effect so that we play in rhythm and tune with the heart of God and the host of his kingdom. Psalm 139:23-24, "Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me and lead me in the way everlasting."

Second, solos are great, but they can be lonely. You are amazing, but WE are better together. I love the *Cello Concerto in B minor, Op. 104* by Antonín Dvořák, it's a unique mingling of light and dark, fun, whimsical and precise, hauntingly beautiful, and technically other-worldly, yet the moment for me that seem most beautiful and powerful is when the strings and woodwinds banter back and forth giving way to a pleasant horn that almost lulls you to nostalgia then welcomes the entire orchestra back into movement which gives rise to introducing the cello and off we go. As much as I love the cello, and I do, the orchestra makes the cello magical. Brothers and sisters, we are the same. Made more fun, beautiful, and useful together for the glory of God. Though at times we all serve different roles that may seem more noticeable or "out front," we all need one another to accomplish the plan and fulfill the purposes of our conductor.

Lastly, we never play to the crowd, only at the pleasure of the conductor. We keep our eyes fixed not on the audience, the opinions of the critics, or the whims of the other musicians; we focus solely on the direction, correction, and encouragement of the conductor. We move when he says move, we breathe when he says breathe, and we play only the notes he has assigned for our part. This gives me great confidence, knowing that he knows his orchestra, that his musicians have been recruited and

trained by him, and that they are put in their proper places for his glory. Let this be the great, freeing joy of your life. To play for our great conductor.

Last, last point. Many trained orchestral musicians would say, "The conductor's breath is the true cue." They often watch for the deep breath of the conductor as he lifts his hand to begin. They depend on his breath to signal movement, and that faith-family is what we need. The very breath of the conductor. So in tune with this note of encouragement, I will resolve to bring a closing cadence.

Job 33:4, "The Spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life."
