WHAT WILL BE WRITTEN OF US?

I have always been a fan of history because history has a unique way of reminding us of where we have been and how we got to where we are, and if we listen and look long enough history can tell us how to make a better future. History can give you a sense, in part, of the people, the culture, the beauty, or the brokenness of an era. For instance, you can read Fitzgerald, or Hemmingway and gather a sense of the season in which they lived. Even through their fictional characters, their historical perspective is incredibly beneficial. You can hear the wine glasses clinking, the beads chattering on dresses, and Gene Austin singing "Bye Bye Blackbird" at some upscale party in the 1920's though it was long before our time. In the same respect, you can read the Diary of Anne Frank or Elie Wiesel's "Night" and feel the weight of human depravity in the Holocaust. I still remember the feelings of despair and disbelief as I read "Night" and wondered how anyone could visit such horrors on another human. Needless to say, history shaped me, moved me, and caused me to look to the future with a fresh perspective. My goal today is to take you on a similar journey. I have been reading about our church's history, our



members' culture over the years, and the incredible things God has done with FBC. I like to ponder the "how." God, how did this church build an FLC? How did this church launch a Celebrate Recovery program, build a sanctuary, buy and enclose an alley, build yet another worship space, launch Vida Abundante, and the list goes on and on? With these thoughts in mind and looking to the future I have been asking how, and I believe I found an answer while examining the past.

A bit of warning. This next paragraph or so may challenge you, unsettle your comfort, and make you more like Jesus if you'll go open-minded with me.

In 1961, when Charles Standridge was writing to our church body, he made two statements that stopped me in my tracks. The sanctuary had just been constructed, and the city and congregation were in a happy frenzy to see the newness and freshness of what God was doing. It was clear that God was doing something unstoppable and remarkable. I feel we are in a similar season now, and we would be remiss to not look back on Brother Standridge's two encouragements to gain insight into what brought us to this point and what will be necessary to take us onward.

"You have been a patient people. Never have I known a people to accommodate themselves to greater inconveniences for so long a time with so little said about it."

"You are a gracious people. It never occurred to you to suggest we build only what we could get by with; instead, you have poured out your wealth and your love for the glory of God."

These quotes from Charles have caused me great pause and contemplation. They have spurred me to be prayerful and even more hopeful. These two statements have forced me to ask difficult questions of myself and our church. Could I honestly write these things about you? Are you a patient people? Do you willingly embrace discomfort for the sake of the gospel and for the good of others? Can I write these of myself? Am I willing to put myself aside for the glory of Jesus and for your good? Am I a patient pastor and are we a patient people? In some regard, I feel I can and yet in others, I feel we are still entrenched in silly divisions, costly gossip, affluent entitlement, and distracted from the main thing. Many have told me, many of you even, that this "is how church is" "part of it" and a myriad of similar estimations, but what if it could be different? What if we could be that unusually unified church? If our goal is to Love God, Love People, and Multiply Disciples then we should be self-effacing, Christ-honoring, and hard-working in our pursuit of unity and togetherness. We should outdo one another in showing honor. This is my dream for our church as we move forward into future projects, strategies, and changes, and as we look at the scripture, I know this dream comes from the word and directly from the heart of God.

I've written enough for you, so I will leave you with this final question. When we come upon the next opportunity what will be written of us? Will I be the patient and gracious pastor that God requires? Will you be the gracious and patient church that he desires? I know what and where we have been faith-family and if we submit fully to Christ it's truly unimaginable where we could be going.
