This moment is also a celebration of a team effort.

- Shayla Roop has gone above and beyond in supporting Shereka's family's educational goals.
- Jessie Kempf helped strengthen Shereka's résumé and led the search for the perfect home and the purchasing process.
- Kelley Frink provided coaching and tools to help structure Shereka's financial success.
- Suzi Moore is currently walking with Shereka through our 1:1 Disciple-ship process, building a beautiful bond along the way.

And behind it all is the generous gift of the OB Brown home by Marsha Coleman, who donated the home and property in honor of her late husband, Danny. Her desire was to see his legacy live on, and through this ministry, it is!

In the coming weeks, we'll assemble a team of volunteers to help move the Leveretts from our A-frame into their forever home. Shortly after, we'll gather a group of volunteers to prepare the A-frame for our next family. Interviews are already underway with the hope of welcoming new residents before the start of the school year.

To our entire church family, we would like to extend our sincere gratitude. Thank you for stepping out in faith, for embracing this ministry, and for pouring love into the lives of real people in mid-Missouri. You are making a difference.

The next time you see Shereka and her family, hug their necks and celebrate with them. And when you see Shayla, Jessie, Kelley, and Suzi, offer your thanks for all the time, effort, energy, and love they've poured into this work.

The price of cemetery plots at Locust Grove will increase from \$300 to \$500 on August 1, 2025. If you would like to purchase a spot or pay for a reserved plot, please contact me before August 1. Cemetery plots in Columbia at Memorial range from \$2500 to \$5500. We have some maintenance planned for this summer on the road. While it is not possible to know the exact numbers, it is estimated that there are 744 buried in the cemetery, with 99 of those unknown as to location. Records show 376 plots are reserved.

Carolyn Doyle

Carolyn was born on March 29, 1934, and is a retired Social Services Worker for State of Missouri, Children's Services, Adoption Specialist.

She was named Social Worker of the Year for Missouri. As she describes it, "I knew the nomination had come from families I'd worked with, and that was very touching. I don't remember what year it was, but somewhere there's a newspaper clipping of me getting the award from Governor John Ashcroft!"

She was baptized in 1934 as an infant in the Congregational Church in Lebanon, MO. She married Charles R Harrison in Lebanon in 1956. They divorced in January 1974 and he passed away the following December. She married Ron Doyle in January 1979; he died in February 1999. They had moved to Columbia in the spring of 1980.

Despite some losses, Carolyn is blessed with an extended family. Daughter Beth Hager-Harrison-Prado, born August 4, 1959. now lives in Columbia. She spent nine years in the Navy, then earned her Master's in Social Work, and recently retired from the VA where she oversaw the homeless programs. Beth was widowed in June of 2024 when Michele, her wife of 10 years, died.

Margaret Anne (Harrison) deVries, born Dec. 9, 1960, was a Registered Nurse. She

passed away in 2021, leaving a husband, Art deVries, and two children.

Hugh Harrison works for the U.S. Postal Service at the Main Columbia Post Office. He is divorced with two adult children.

Ronald T. Doyle lives in Mexico, MO. and is on medical disability. He has a stepson who is Carolyn's fourth grandson.

There are pets too, two brown tabby cats, Fred and the Duchess.

Carolyn is active in the Boone County Historical Society. "I volunteer at the front desk and am on the Historic Sites Committee



Lemon Squares

2 cups flour

1 cup butter, softened

1/2 cup powdered sugar

4 eggs

2 cups granulated sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp salt


2 tsp grated lemon peel

4 Tblsp fresh lemon juice

Heat oven to 350. Mix flour, butter, and powdered sugar. Press evenly in a 15x8 inch pan building up on the sides 1/2 inch. Bake for 20 minutes.

Beat remaining ingredients until light and fluffy. Pour over hot crust. Bake 30 minutes or until no indention remains in the center when touched.

ON THE REZ

With Kathy Hughes

Plans are underway for our annual adult mission to Re-Member on the Pine Ridge Lakota reservation in South Dakota. Right now we have 5 confirmed travelers, and a possible three other. As they always ask,

"When ya comin' back?"

That would be Sept 20 – Sept 25. It is the last week of volunteers for the 2025 season, so it promises to be an amazing week.

Volunteers stay together in the same building, segregated men and women's rooms. We sleep on the same bunk beds we build and put into homes. Speaking of which, volunteers are assigned to teams, so we will get to know the other volunteers pretty well. I actually still correspond with a volunteer from 6 years ago! It is not uncommon to re-connect with volunteers from other trips, especially on Senior Week. Connections.

Last year one of the volunteer team leaders, Rick, was from Columbia!! We enjoyed his company so much Keith Anderson is signed up as a volunteer team leader to work with Rick for two weeks! Connections.

And teams buddy up for projects, so it is also pretty usual for two or more volunteers from our group to work together on a job site. That is always fun.

Early mornings and late evenings our group usually gathers together to discuss the best and worst of the day – seeing the stark poverty and unmet needs is always hard. Sitting and talking with a Lakota family member, reading a book to a child in the shade of the work trailer, seeing an elder's reaction to the gift of a bed is heartwarming.

Each evening an elder speaker joins everyone in the great room, to educate the volunteers on the Lakota creation story,



local events, music, Lakota hand games, etc. This is an opportunity to talk with those who are dialed in to the culture and events of the tribe. Because we have had volunteers traveling to Re-Member for more than 10 years, we have built up a trust with some members, and have made some REAL connections with teachers, older AIM members (American Indian Movement – warriors for the tribe), social workers and others. Some of us have connected deeply enough that we have been honored to meet with individuals or their families outside of our Re-Member time. Connections.

Our team is meeting monthly for a casual (shorts and tees!) fellowship and potluck meal to get to know each other better and what to expect with Re-Member and on the reservation. There are still a few slots open for our week. If you are interested in joining us or even just learning more about this mission, come join us for a meal. Our next meeting is at my house, (Kathy Hughes) Saturday, June 21st at 5ish. We would love to see you!!! We also plan to meet again in July and August, to finalize our trip the donations we will take, etc.
