

One of our amazing volunteers (a retired nurse) very calmly gives the child the Heimlich maneuver and dislodges the candy, saving the child. Our volunteer was a blessing to be sure! Then shortly after, another volunteer sat down with the family and they all prayed together.

About an hour later a client was waiting for her number to be called and when we went to greet her, she appeared to be sleeping. But no! She said, "I was praying".

And then... one of our food room volunteers was talking to a client handing him his food and the client said he was having a very bad day. So they prayed together on the loading dock. Wow! What an amazing group of 28 volunteers we are blessed with and all their amazing skills and love of God. God is sure in this building you can feel His presence every day.

The 2025–2026 school year is off to an exciting and spirit-filled start at Livingstone Adventist Academy!

Before classes began, our faculty and staff joined with school board members for our annual **Prayer Walk**. This meaningful tradition allows us to dedicate the school year to God—praying over each classroom, teacher, and student who will walk through our doors.

Our **Junior High and High School students** kicked off the year with campouts designed for bonding, team-building, and spiritual connection in the beauty of nature. Our school theme this year is LOVE. The first third of our mission is to know God. As stated in 1John 4:16, God is Love. We are charged to share the Gospel with the world, to show the character of God through our living. This is how the world knows we follow Christ (John 13:35) and is what draws all creation to Him (John 12:32). A very clear definition

of what love is is found in 1Corinthians 13:4-6. We will be doing a detailed dive into these 15 attributes of love described — a guiding principles we are excited to explore and live out together throughout the year.
