Read Daniel 3:1-18 and answer questions 1-5 on page 59 in the Be Resolute book.

## Additional questions:

- 1. In verses 1-6, does the text say what the image is of, and what do you think about it?
- 2. In verses 2-3, what are these administrators, for example satraps?
- 3. In verses 5, 7, 10 and 15, what are these instruments, and as original Greek words, when did they appear in the Middle East?
- 4. In verses 8-12, why were Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego turned into the king?
- 5. In verse 16, are these three being flippant?
- 6. In verses 17-18, did these three know that God would save them, and what did this show?
- 7. What do God and Satan try to do with our faith?

## The 3 Sieges of Jerusalem:

#1 605 BC King Nebuchadnezzar invades Jerusalem (2 Kings 24:1-2), Jehoiakim is King of Judah, Daniel and friends are captured and trained to serve in the Babylonian government (Daniel 1-2).

8 years later (2 Kings 24:12),

#2 597 BC Ezekiel and 10,000 taken captive, Jehoiachin is King of Judah, Jeremiah sends word to the Babylonian exiles (Jeremiah 29:1-4).

19 years later (2 Kings 25:8),

#3 586 BC Temple and wall destroyed (2 Kings 24:17-25:10), Zedekiah is King of Judah, King Nebuchadnezzar sets up idol, possibly with some temple gold (Daniel 3).
