

A Thanksgiving Epistle

This Thanksgiving I give thanks to God for you, The Rustburg United Methodist Church community. A family who lives hard, loves hard and serves God, family, community and the world with gusto. A congregation that is not afraid to give their all in every situation or pull back in a bad one. You don't just do church; you are church.

You are family not only for the congregation but for those around you and the world. You are not fooled by things that are passing but sit together and look at

things as a team. At times there is struggle within the church community to meet the needs of the wider community. You have a way of looking at self-first and then hashing things out to deal with tough situations. Then you move from the heart of the whole to do what is right for all even when you don't all agree. I thank God for a fiery office seraphim administrator who dreams and has visions of bridging all of us and Lisa who hold the companion fiery sword.

Bible study is a place of fascination with the word of God, where people from thousands of years ago speak to modern day people. There are times when the class gasps because sisters and brothers of "the cloud of witnesses" enter the room to show us they were dealing with the same issues and found ways to still praise God. There are quiet moments when we realize the same God who moved their obstacles will remove ours. There are other times when a personal breakthrough brings tears for us all or the joy of laughter. 
Giving Thanks

The puzzle is based on Psalm 100





