Roasted Sweet Potato Salad Ingredients

- 3 pounds sweet potatoes
- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 inch chipotle pepper adobo sauce
- 1 teaspoon balsamic vinegar
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup cranberries
- 1/2 cup pecans
- 2 tablespoons chives

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees (convection works best).
- Peel and cut potatoes into 1 pieces.
- Toss to coat with 2 tablespoon of olive oil.
- Arrange in a single layer on two baking sheets
- Roast for 35 minutes
- Mix 2 tablespoons oil, pepper puree, vinegar, salt and pepper to make a dressing
- Combine cranberries, pecans, chives and cooked sweet potatoes in a medium bowl, drizzle with dressing, cover. Refrigerate until chilled.

CHILI CHEESE BALL

Beat until smooth:

- 1 8oz. pkg. cream cheese
- 1 envelope chili seasoning mix
- 3 Tbsp. medium or hot salsa

- 1. Stir in one cup chopped pecans and one cup taco shredded cheese. Shape into ball and roll in additional taco cheese.
- 2. Can be frozen for up to three months. Serve with tortilla chips or crackers.



CHOCOLATE CHIP CHEESE BALL

- 1 8oz. pkg. cream cheese
- ½ cup butter, softened
- ½ tsp. vanilla
- ³/₄ cup confectioners sugar
- 2 T. brown sugar
- ³/₄ cup miniature semisweet chocolate chips
- ³/₄ fup finely chopped pecans

- 1. Beat the cream cheese, butter and vanilla until fluffy. Gradually add sugars, beat until combined. Stir in chocolate chips.
- 2. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours. Shape into a ball. Refrigerate for at least one hour before serving. Just before serving, roll cheese ball in chopped pecans. Serve with honey or chocolate graham crackers.

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?



THE CHRISTMAS STORY Matthew 1:18 – 2:12 Luke 1:26 – 2:21

The traditional Christmas story, as depicted in crèche scenes and greeting cards, is a mixture of the birth narratives in Matthew and Luke to which is added some pious traditions. Mary, Joseph and the Infant Jesus are pictured at the manger along with the angels, shepherds and the wise men. These are all mentioned in Matthew and Luke. Tradition has added sheep, cows and goats and other favorite animals with the camels of the wise men standing in the background. However, the Gospels do not mention this menagerie. Matthew pictures the wise men coming later and visiting Jesus in a house (Mt 2:11).

The Birth Narratives of the Gospels

The Christmas story in the Gospels focuses our attention on the birth of Jesus as a world-transforming event. This is clear from the beginning. God has come to be with us humans to transform us (Mt 1:22-23). Jesus "is called Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us." The Infant Jesus is the Savior, through whom God acts to forgive sins. His name means "God saves" (2:21).

How God Saves


The Christmas story tells of how God brings salvation through Jesus in two contrasting ways. In salvation God is reaching down to us no matter how battered and broken we may be. God meets us in our poverty and weakness. God reveals his saving power to poor, marginal people: not the rich or powerful. God empowered a poor Jewish girl by the Holy Spirit to bear the Christ. Mary and Joseph could not afford a place to stay. The birth was celebrated by shepherds, poor lads who lived out in the hills with their flocks.

This birth was an act of sheer grace. God does not wait until we are good enough to be saved. God reaches out to us where we are. God is fully present in His glory in this act of revelation. God does not deal with us at send-hand. God's glory is always near. Angels bring the glad tidings from the highest heaven that transformed a stable into a royal throne. Wise men came from a far country to worship the Infant King with rich gifts. The heavens were reordered to provide a star to lead them.

Mary pondered the meaning of the mysterious events surrounding the birth of her child. Luke tells us His mother treasured all these things in her heart (Lk 2:52). Christmastime is our opportunity to treasure these events and ponder them in our hearts. God is reaching out to each one of us, no matter who we are, to save us. God meets us in our guilt, fear and pain to reveal the glory that is ours in faith. Dare to believe anew that God's own self is touching you with the glory of new life.
