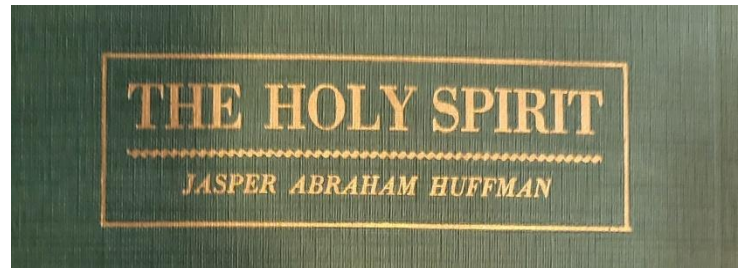

Pictured on the front are the three wisemen with the caption:

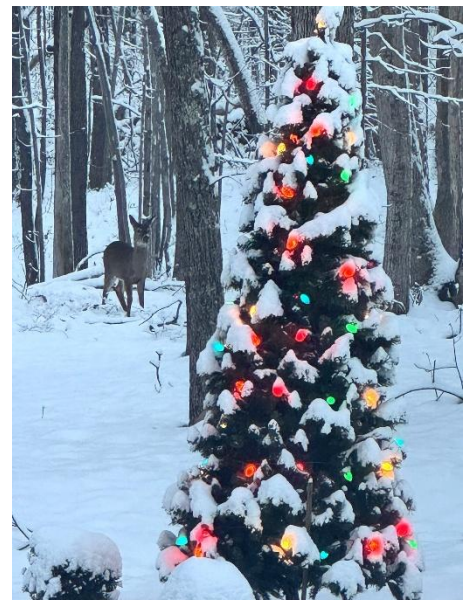
'WISE MEN came with treasures of earth in their hands... and left with the Treasure of Heaven in their Hearts'.

AVOIDING SCAMS

But people who long to be rich soon begin to do all kinds of wrong things to get money: things that hurt them and make them evil-minded and finally send them to their ruin. For the love of money is the first step toward all kinds of sin.

Some people have even turned away from God because of their love for it, and as a result have pierced themselves with many sorrows. 1 Timothy 6:9-10

It's that time again: time to re-post the 'scams' article. Usually, we see an uptick in the winter of folks-who-need-Jesus attempting to impersonate the pastor or other leaders of the church, asking for gift cards, etc. There are ways to check if such communications are legitimate...and all of them start by checking the e-mail address, texter, or caller. Is the number or address the one that's on record? Are all the dots in the right space? If there's even the slightest doubt, call the person directly.

Common church scams are:

- Clergy Impersonation
- Gift Card Fraud

Warning signs include:

- Unexpected requests for money or gift cards, especially from leaders.
- Messages with bad grammar, typos, or vague instructions.
- Requests to keep the request a secret.
- Urgent pleas for help with limited details.
- Emails/texts from unfamiliar numbers/addresses even if they seem known.

This past summer we even had a person impersonate a church member to ask for a copy of our Directory (Cheryl spotted them right away). In many ways it is promising that we keep our data so off-line and off the beaten path that the scammer has to ask! The FBI has this to say: "No one — and no device — is immune from the threat. Every organization and every individual needs to take smart, reasonable steps to protect their own devices and systems and to learn how to spot and avoid scams. The only way we can protect ourselves is by our own vigilance." Remember: if a communication feels suspect, go ahead and talk to the person directly. And if you would like to report the scammer you can do so at the [Campbell County Sheriff's Office](#) and through the FBI's [Internet Crime Complaint Center](#).

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

USE COMMON SENSE

Do you know the caller or visitor? Have you seen their credentials?

IF YOU HAVE A DOUBT

Close the door, disconnect the call, or delete the email.

PROTECT SENSITIVE INFORMATION

Never share your social security number, bank account, birth date or credit card information in person, over the phone or through email with individuals you DO NOT know.

REPORT SCAMS TO PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS

Report scams to your local law enforcement agency. To report a consumer complaint, or identity theft, call the Federal Trade Commission at 1-877-FTC-HELP, or do so online at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](#).

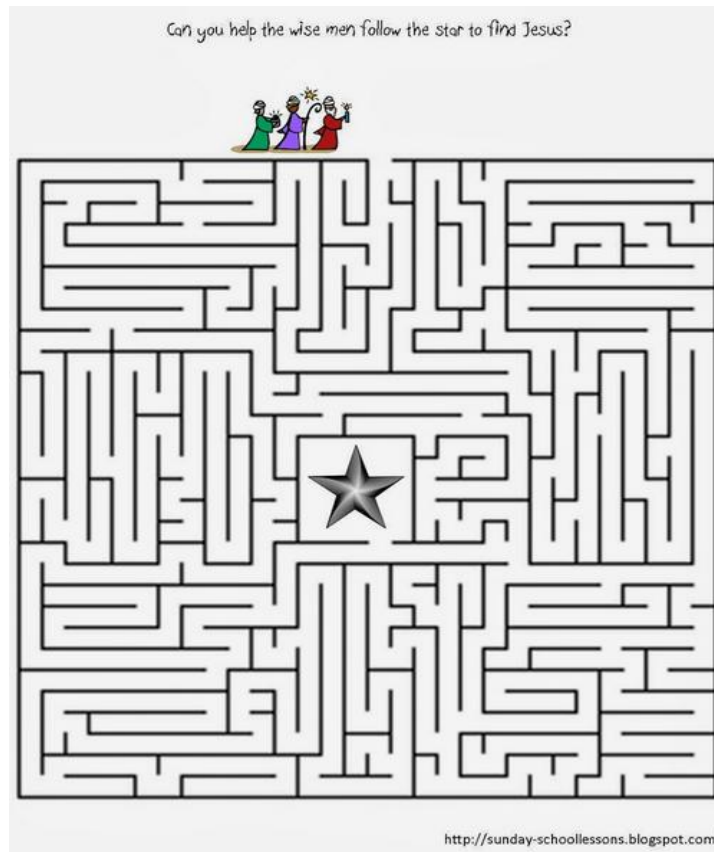
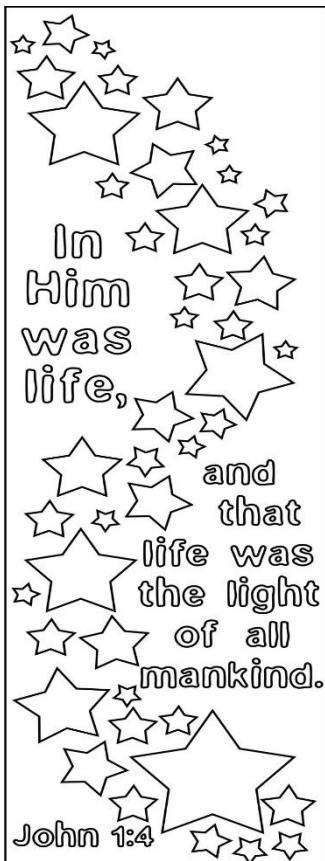
