Westminster Larger Catechism Q. 100 & 101

Leader: *What special things are we to consider in the Ten Commandments?*

All: We are to consider, in the Ten Commandments, the preface, the substance of the commandments themselves, and several reasons annexed to some of them, the more to enforce them.

Leader: *What is the preface to the Ten Commandments?*

All: The preface to the Ten Commandments is contained in these words, I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. Wherein God manifests his sovereignty; as being JEHOVAH, the eternal, immutable, and

almighty God, having his being in and of himself, and giving being to all his words and works and that he is a God in covenant, as with Israel of old, so with all his people; who, as he brought them out of their bondage in Egypt, so he delivers us from our spiritual captivity; and that therefore we are bound to take him for our God alone; and to keep all his commandments.


