Questions

• What's the difference between being 'relevant' and being 'relative' when it comes to sharing God's truth?

- Mark asks, 'How does the church with the greatest and most needed message of all time become irrelevant to those who need it most?' How would you answer this question?
- In what ways might we substitute religion (rules and systems) for relationship with God in our own lives?
- What 'messes' do you find yourself hesitant to enter into, and why?
- Can you share an example of when the church has held onto something from the past that no longer serves its original purpose?
- What does it look like practically to be 'in sync with the Spirit' in your daily life?
- Mark says, 'The most relevant thing you can do is meet somebody at their point of need.' Share a time when someone met you at your point of need and how it impacted you.
- How might our growth group become more relevant to those in our community who don't yet know Jesus?

Life Application

This week, practice being relevant by intentionally meeting someone at their point of need. Look for one person in your life (at work, in your neighborhood, at school, or even in your family) who is struggling or hurting in some way. Ask God to help you see what they truly need, then take a step to meet that need - whether it's practical help, a listening ear, words of encouragement, or sharing how God has helped you through similar circumstances. Remember the phrase from the sermon: 'Do for one what you wish you could do for all.' Come prepared next week to share how this experience impacted both you and the person you helped.

Key Takeaways

- We become irrelevant when we substitute religion for relationship, focusing on rules rather than connecting with God and others.
